NEWSLETTER NO.2 December 1986



As mentioned elsewhere in this letter, the Anglesea Recreation and Sports Club is holding its Annual Regatta on the river on New Year's Day.

The first Regatta was held on the same river on New Year's Day 1913. After that, a group of locals, led by S.R.J.Mawson (president) and H.Parrington (secretary) decided that the event should be held annually and as a result of their efforts a commodious clubhouse was erected and in it installed two fine racing boats which were to be used for the four-oared challenge race.

• The shed was duly opened before an audience of about 100 people by Mrs.Mawson. Following that the boats were carried out and placed at the water's edge where Mrs Jackson (local licensee) christened the first boat "Anglesea" and Mrs.McMillan the second boat "Gladstone" The christenings took place amid cheers. The ceremony concluded with three cheers and a "tiger".

Apart from a period during the Second World War, the Regatta has been held annually ever since, using the same clubhouse (although recently reclad through the generosity of Alcoa) and the same boats. It is believed that it is worthy of inclusion in the "Book of Records" as perhaps, if not certainly, the longest running boat race using the original boats.

ANNUAL DINNER

Our Annual Dinner was a great success, both financially and socially. There were about 100 present and the occasion was notable for the fact that the Anglesea Hotel was 100 years old in November 1986, having been granted a conditional licence for the Anglesea "Anglers' and Tourists' Club" in premises owned by Mr.Jackson. To mark the occasion, the Society presented the hotel staff with a cake, suitably decorated.

During the proceedings a book was presented to our past President, Gavin Cook, who has given the Society two years' excellent leadership, and, during his term of office, has seen the acquisition of our own building at 5 McMillan Street.

PROPOSAL FOR LIFE MEMBERSHIP


