2ND JANUARY	1893	ALBAN G (JOHNNY) MOYES, CRICKETER AND CRICKETING AUTHOR WAS BORN.
13th January 29th January	1893 1893	ROY CAZALEY, NOTES VFL FOOTBALLER WAS BORN. THE FEDERAL BANK OF AUSTRALIA CRASHED IN MELBOURNE BEGINNING THE SERIES OF BANK CRASHES THROUGHOUT AUSTRALIA.
30TH JANUARY	1893	ALBERT JACKA, FIRST AUSTRALIAN VICTORIA CROSS WINNER IN WORLD WAR 1, WAS BORN.
2ND FEBRUARY	1893	IN THE MIDST OF TORRENTIAL RAINS AND FLOODING WHICH DEVASTATED BRISBANE, SOUTH-EAST QUEENSLAND AND THE NORTH COAST OF NEW SOUTH WALES, AUSTRALIA HAD ITS RECORD RAINFALL FOR 24 HOURS, 35 INCHES 71 POINTS (WE'LL LEAVE YOU TO WORK OUT THE MM) RECORDED AT CHROMHURST NEAR BRISBANE.
3RD FEBRUARY	1943	A F VLASOF, THE FIRST USSR AMBASSADOR TO AUSTRALIA ARRIVED IN SYDNEY. (YOU'LL NOTE DURING THE WAR!)
14TH FEBRUARY	1893	LORD SHEFFIELD, WHO HAD LED AN ENGLISH TEST CRICKET TEAM TO AUSTRALIA WROTE FROM NAPLES CONFIRMING HIS INTENTION OF OFFERING £150 FOR A SHIELD FOR INTERCOLONIAL CRICKET COMPETITIONS, FIRST COMPETED FOR IN THE 1892-93 SEASON.
25TH FEBRUARY	1893	THE VICTORIAN DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE SENT A TRIAL SHIPMENT OF FRUIT ON THE BRITANNIA TO
3RD MARCH	1893	ENGLAND. THE RAILWAY FROM WARRACKNABEAL TO BEULAH IN THE WIMMERA WAS OPENED.
8TH MARCH 11TH MARCH	1793 1893	DAVID JONES, LEADING SYDNEY STOREKEEPER, BORN. DR W RUSSELL NOLAN CONDUCTED THE FIRST RECOGNISED APPENDECTOMY ON A PATIENT AT TOOWOOMBA IN QUEENSLAND.
25TH MARCH	1893	GEELONG BORN OSCAR ASCHE MADE HIS FIRST STAGE APPEARANCE IN LONDON AS ROBERTS IN MAN AND WOMAN AT THE OPERA COMIQUE THEATRE.
26TH MARCH	1943	THE OPERA COMIQUE THEATRE. THE JAPANESE OCCUPIED NAURU ISLAND AND EXECUTED LIEUT.COL. CHAMBERS, THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE ISLAND, AND OTHER OFFICIALS WHO HAD NOT MADE THEIR ESCAPE.

ANGLESEA ALSO RECEIVED A MENTION IN THE SEGMENT AROUND THE SOCIETIES,

THE FOLLOWING ITEM WAS NOTICED BY TWO MEMBERS IN A RECENT EDITION OF THIS BRITAIN AND AS YOU WILL READ HAS INTEREST FOR THIS PART OF THE WORLD!

AS VISITORS TO LONDON'S KENSINGTON GARDENS PASS THE STATUE OF QUEEN VICTORIA WHICH OVERLOOKS THE ROUND POND, FEW REALISE THAT IT WAS ACTUALLY CARVED BY ONE OF THE QUEEN'S OWN DAUGHTERS. UNVEILED IN 1893, THE STATUE IS THE WORK OF PRINCESS LOUISE, THE SIXTH CHILD OF VICTORIA AND ONE OF THE MOST GIFTED AND ARTISTIC OF THE NINE ROYAL CHILDREN. BY THE AGE OF FIVE SHE COULD READ, WRITE AND COUNT IN ENGLISH, GERMAN AND FRENCH. SHE MARRIED JOHN DOUGLAS SUTHERLAND CAMPBELL, THE MARQUIS OF LORNE AT ST GEORGE'S CHAPEL, WINDSOR ON MARCH 21ST, 1891. WHEN THE MARQUIS WAS APPOINTED GOVERNOR-GENERAL OF CANADA , PRINCESS LOUISE ACCOMPANIED HIM AND DURING THEIR TIME THERE SHE WAS CALLED THE "QUEEN OF CANADA" UNDERTAKING A HECTIC PROGRAM OF OFFICIAL ENGAGEMENTS. BACK IN ENGLAND SHE BECAME HONORARY COLONEL-IN-CHIEF OF THE 91ST ARGYLLSHIRE HIGHLANDERS REGIMENT AND DESIGNED A NEW CAP BADGE WHICH THEY STILL WEAR TO THIS DAY, AS THE NEW CENTURY DAWNED, LORNE'S FATHER, THE DUKE OF ARGYLE DIED AND HE INHERITED THE TITLE, HIS WIFE BECOMING THE DUCHESS OF ARGYLE. WHEN HER HUSBAND DIED IN 1914 IT ENDED MORE THAT 40 YEARS OF MARRIAGE. WHEN WAR BROKE OUT HER PET PROJECT BECAME THE SETTING UP OF A HOSPITAL - ERSKINE HOUSE -IN RENFRENSHIRE WHERE WOUNDED SOLDIERS COULD BE FITTED WITH ARTIFICIAL LIMBS. SHE PASSED AWAY ON DECEMBER 3RD, 1939 AT THE AGE OF 91 YEARS, THE LONGEST LIVING OF QUEEN VICTORIA'S DAUGHTERS, AND MANY OF HER ARTISTIC WORKS STILL REMAIN THROUGHOUT ENGLAND AS A LASTING MEMORIAL TO HER.

OTHER ITEMS CAME FROM ADELE DAVIDSON AND TED PAVIA (AN OSCILLOGRAPH) AND SOME PHOTOGRAPHS FOR OUT ACTIVITIES ALBUM. KEEP UP THE GOOD WORK AND BE ON THE LOOK-OUT FOR ITEMS THAT COULD PRESERVE ANGLESEA'S PAST FOR YOUNG PEOPLE MANY THANKS TO ALL.
