Well, we have finally got around to pretting the second of our News Letters out. It is hoped that this publication will be of some help and interest to our members, as well as anyone else that may read it.

THE LATTER DAY SAINTS.

The Genealogical Society of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, Inc., is located at 50 E. North Temple St., Salt Lake City, Utah. 84150. United States. It is one of the most active Genealogical organizations in the world. Although it was founded to assist Church members in compiling their own trees, it is also opened to the general public. The society had a world-wide range of data, ranging from family genealogies to various histories of countries. In Victoria, the Latter Day Saints have a Genealogical Centre, located at 185 Wests earth St., Northcote. Its hours are Tuesday and Wednesday, IO a.m. - 2 p.m., Friday, 6.30 p.m. - IO p.m. and Saturday, IO a.m. - 6 p.m. Exactly what is held there, I don't know. They do have a few micro-fische viewers and records. They also have an indes of the General Registar held at St. Catherine's House, London.

The Latter Day Saints have a micro-fische viewer and records, held at their Traralgon Branch. This is situated in Kosciusko St., next to Kildare College. Eventually it is hoped to have a Genealogical section, set up to that in Northcote. For an appointment to visit the church, you can ring Mrs Tainton on . Don't be put off if someone answers 'La trobe Valley Refrigeration", as it is the right number. There is no set charge for the use of the micro-fische, but you can give a donation to cover the cost. Please note that the machine has no print out and any information gathered has to be written down by hand. The plates have most counties of England and Wales. There are quite a few foreign countries. I even found some miscellaneous records of Australia, that Mrs. Tainton didn't know about. These Australian ones mainly referred to New South Wales and Victoria, dating from I800 - I9IO (not to sure). There is also a micro-fische located over at Korumburra. Mrs. Joan Alger, 25 Peterson St., Korumburra, is in charge of this one. In a couple of months, Mrs. Tainton hopes to have the new plates which will have over six million names on it. The present ones have about sixty thousand names. What a difference!

GERMAN BACKGROUNDS.

Did you know that in South Australia, during World War One, quite a large percent of the population with German Backgrounds changed their surnames. An alphabetical index of names changed by Deed Poll from I9I6 are held by the General Registar Office, Torres Building, Victoria Square, Adelaide, South Australia. The cost to search the index is about \$1.20. The index has both the former and new surname.

THE RUSSELL'S OF TOONGABBIE.

The Russell family, consisting of three or maybe four brothers, came from Scotland, and settled in Toongabbie in the I860's. Two brothers, John and William Russell with their party from Tarraville, were credited with the discovery of gold at the Russell's Creek diggings in I860, although controversy raged at the time whether they were the actual discoverers. John Russel then moved to Toongabbie, where he established a Blacksmith's shop in 1865. In 1867 Russell selected land, possibly in the Tyers area and later sold the Blacksmith's shop to another brother David. John died in Traralgon in 1903 and is buried at Toongabbie in the Russel family plot. David Russell, born in Scotland in 1839, married Elizabeth McKenzie and migrated to South Australia in 1865 and then, crossed to Mictoria in 1869. He took over his brother's business and also, selected land for himself in the Vicinity. They had seven children, three sons and four daughters. One of the sons, David Smith Russell (my Great-Grandfather), eventually took over the Blacksmith shopaand kept it until about 1920. From there, he went to the Nambrok area, near Sale, where the family ran the local Post Office and Telephone Exchange, as well as the blacksmith shop alongside. Another some William Burrie Russell, went to Drouin and established a Blacksmith and Wheelwright's business there. I don't know much about this man except that he, his wife, and two infant sons are buried at the Drouin cemetery. The third son, John Russell, went to Orbost where he, also, established a Blacksmith's shop, in about 1890. At the same time he rented a farm where he milked cows before and after his long days at the Smithy. John Russell became a major landholder in the area and helped establish the local pig industry. He was a Director of the Orbost Butter factory for 52 years, and Chairman for 9 years, so he played a major part in the development of the dairy industry. John Russell married and had a large family whose descendants, I believe, still live in the Orbost area. I would be very interested in finding descendants of the Russell family, who may possess information, old photographs, or documents which I could borrow and copy.

Then Ballarat until 1873, then lived at Inglewood. Married Elizabeth Longston at Sandhurst, 1879 (Bendigo). Took a grant of land at Wychitella (Near Inglewood & Wedderburn), resided there till approx 1900. May have moved back to Ballarat round 1900? Following children so far known: James born Wychitella, 1883.

William John born Wychitella, 1883.

Alexander Rowan Henry born Wychitella, I885. Died at Inglewood in I885, buried in the Inglewood cemetery.

Alexander Somerville died in December of I884, and is buried in the New Cemetery, Ballarat. Age $47 \cdot$
