Fees for searches and extracts

1. Particular search: A particular search is a search for a specified entry made by a member of the General Register Office staff. Such a search can be undertaken only if sufficient identifying information is supplied.

Statutory registers of births, deaths, marriages and adoptions. registers (pre 1855) and census records (1841-1891) See note (a).

- First or only extract of entry following particular search £ 4-00 - Second or any subsequent extract of the same entry issued at the time £ 1-50

£1-30

- Abbreviated certificate of birth. See note (b)

- Particular search in the indexes to the statutory registers where specified entry untraced for each period of 5 years or part thereof.

- Particular search in the Parish registers where specified entry untraced for each period of 5 years or part thereof

€ 2-00 - Particular search in the census records where specified entry untraced for each census searched. £ 2-00

- 2. General search: A general search is a search, over any period of years for any number of entries, made by any member of the public. Applicant must be age 16 or over. Statutory registers of births, deaths, marriages and adoptions. Parish registers (pre 1855) and census records (1841-1891) See note (a).
 - General search in the indexes to the statutory registers £ 4-50 (per day or part thereof)
 - General search in the parish registers or census records £ 3-00 (per day or part thereof).

HOIRS

(a) Searches are permitted in and extracts are issued from the 1881 and 1891 census records on condition that no information derived from them is published without the permission of the Registrar General.

(b) Abbreviated certificate shows only the name and surname of the person, date and place of birth, and sex.

Cost of certificates when applied for by post - St. Catherine's House: For full certificates of Birth, Death or Marriage \pounds 8-50 For a short certificate of birth

TASMANIA

"Hobart Town First Settlers Association".

This association was formed by people who could trace their ancestry to those who sailed from Spithead, England on either the 'Calcutta' or the 'Ocean' on 24th April 1803. Lieutenant-Colonel David Collins, who was to lead an expedition which led to the foundation of hobart Town was aboard. Anyone who can claim to be descended from the passengers of these ships is eligible for membership. The cost is approx. \$6-00. Write to The Secretary, Mr. R. Lord, 4 Seaview Avenue, Taroona. SHIPPING RECORDS IN THE SOUTH AUSTRALIAN ARCHIVES

1. Passenger Lists: incoming; overseas and interstate.

(a) Lists of people arriving in S.A. from overse as parts, incomplete and mostly from unofficial sources 1836-45. These lists were compiled by many different agencies - the amount of data supplied is very limited but varies according to the compiler. Often the sources do not give forenames or initials, names of wives and children, place of origin, age or indicate family relationships.

Index: all sources indexed in one volume arranged by name of passenger. Reference: 1048

(b) Official lists mainly of immigrants assisting in S.A. under U.K. assisting

passage schemes: 1847-86.

Not all lists have survived. All lists give passengers names, most give ages, occupation and marital status, while some give county of origin.

Passenger lists held in London relating to these voyages were destroyed in 1900.

(c) Index of passenger lists of ships arriving in S.A. from overseas published in newspapers 1846-87. The newspapers to which this index refers are held in the Newspaper Section of the State Library *, together with a copy of the index. The passenger lists appearing in newspapers are very incomplete, they include many unassisted passengers and German immigrants. Personal details about individuals are rarely given - the lists often omit forenames and initials. Ref: quote the title given above.

(d) Official lists of immigrants arriving in S.A. from Hamburg 1851-86. Not all lists have survived, nor are the holdings complete. Some German arrivals are listed in (b) and (c) above.

- (e) Official passenger lists of people arriving in S.A. from overseas (incomplete holdings) 1888-1940.

- (f) Index to people arriving in S.A. from interstate 1837-50. This index refers to manifest books for ships arriving in S.A. and the S.A. Gazette and Colonial Register. The sources above give names of passengers only. Ref: quote title given above.
- (g) Official lists of people arriving in S.A. from interstate (very incomplete holdings) 1901-39.

 (a) Register of applications by labourers in the U.K. for free passage to S.A. 1836-41. Gives age, occupation, and U.K. address of applicant; sex and age (but no names) of dependants accompanying applicant. Does not indicate whether applicant actually embarked or arrived in S.A.

Crew Lists - The Australian Archives Office, South Australian Branch holds a variety of records relating to ship's crews including desertions and discharges from 1852.

Passenger Lists - Passenger lists for overseas and interstate voyages were regularly published in newspapers. The Newspaper section of the State Library * holds an index to interstate arrivals and departures reported in newspapers from 1836-55 (lists for later years are progressively being added); and an index to overseas arrivals (1846-87) published in newspapers, a copy of which is held in the Archives.
