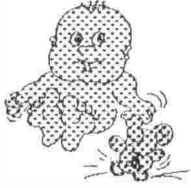

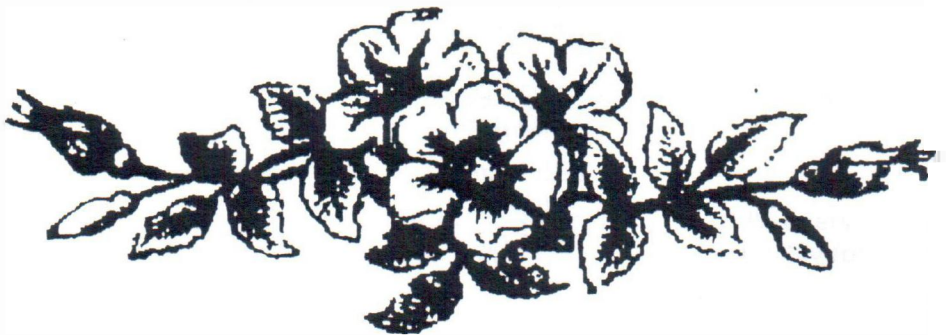

Firstly if your family history leads you to Moruya N.S.W then it may be worth dropping a line, a S.A.E and \$10.00 to Kate Boyce of the Moruya & District Historical Society, P.O. Box 259, Moruya, N.S.W. 2537. I did and within a week of my request I had a reply with some new information, from the local church records, on my 3rd great grandparents. The information was not on the official marriage certificate.

My next successful enquiry was to the Tipperary Heritage Unit, turn to the middle pages for details.

Why Not Join a CLAN?

On a search for contacts recently I came across a lady who although not directly related has put me in touch with the CLAN MacMillan Society of Australia. With MacMillan being my main area of family history research I jumped at the chance of joining. Included in the membership are 4 newsletters a year.

With all members interests being the same it is a great means of gathering information. On a recent posting I received a list of all the McMillans from the Assisted Immigration Listings at the public Records Office. We receive regular news from the Clan Center at Finlaystone in Scotland and in November 1997 had a visit from the Clan Chief George MacMillan of MacMillan and Knap with his wife Jane. Unfortunately I only learned of the Clan after this momentous event so missed out on a meeting.

I recently went along with the group to the Braeside LDS family History Library and had a chance to check the new entries in the British Vital Records, Scottish Church Records and the IGI with Addendum (members submissions) on CD rom. Braeside is the only library in Victoria with the Scottish Civil Registration Index and is certainly worth a visit. The Clan also attends most Highland Gatherings especially Ringwood where each year June and Max Senior man a tent with displays of our heritage. The Council Of Clans was held here and 2 members of each affiliated Clan were able to attend.

The Clan MacMillan Society of Australia was originally established in 1983 and aims to foster kinship between members of the Clan and its various Septs. These include MacMillan, Macmillan, McMillan, McMullen, McMullan, Millen, Bell, Baxter, Brown and Walker.

With an annual membership fee of only \$10.00I believe it offers great value as a research tool and an opportunity to meet with fellow Genealogists with the same name interests.

There are many other Clans and if you are looking into Scottish History why not think of joining yours?

Tipperary Heritage Unit

The Tipperary Heritage Unit has exclusive access to the Catholic Baptismal and Marriage records of the 46 parishes of the Archdiocese of Cashel and Emly, which includes part of North and South Tipperary and South East Limerick. I paid them \$30 something Australian dollars and now know the names of my 3rd great grandfather's parents and siblings and have opened up more doors for research into that family. Initially they told me research could take up to ten weeks but I had results posted to me within three weeks of handing over my credit card details.

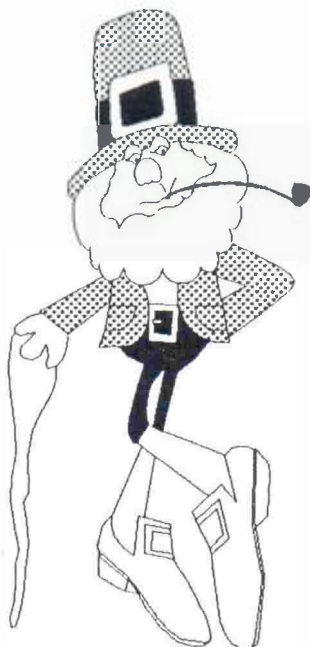

The following list of persons (mostly cooks) has been extracted from "Recipes of Old England" by Bernard N Bessinger published 1973 . The list has been compiled by members of the Genealogical Computing Group of the NZ Society of Genealogists.

The next file is Churchanston, StPeter & St Paul, SOMERSET (formerly Devon), Burials 1678-1902.

Details taken from the Long Melford, Suffolk Parish Magazine October 1882.

The transcriptions published here, Trull, All Saints, Somerset, Burials 1678-1889 have been privately made from fiche copies of the parish registers purchased from the Somerset Archive and Record Service who take no responsibility for their accuracy or completeness.

Ted Wildy has indexed The Yachtsman's WHO'S WHO - 1938-1939.

The Topographical dictionary of Yorkshire for the year 1822 by Thomas Langdale, has been transcribed by Colin Hinson.

The following Essex files, Elizabethan Essex , Elizabethan Life-Wills of Essex Gentry and Yeoman, Elizabethan Life -Wills of Essex Gentry and Yeoman (2), Elizabethan Life in Essex- Disorder, Elizabethan Life- Morals and the Church Courts, Essex Families, have all been compiled by Mike Foster of Wellington New Zealand, and will be of benefit to Essex researchers.

Here is the essential Pigots Directory of Essex 1823/24.

What follows are extracts from an article printed in the Illustrated London News on Saturday July 6th 1850. It isa contemporary account of the procedure of Emigration from the port of Liverpool to the New World and the Colonies.

RAF Ibsley was located on the east side of the A338 Ringwood to Salisbury Road.

The following information was compiled by Peter Dunn, 7 Monarch St., Runcorn, QLD 4113, Australia in July 1993. The details are from a book titled "Strike and Return" written by Peter Firkins. Peter Dunn's then-in-law is John Goulevitch DFC who as one of the lucky survivors of 460 Squadron.

The names in Scowmen from the Phantom Fleet have been extracted from:- "The Phantom Fleet" by Ted Ashby 9th July 1988.

Immigrants from the Borders of Scotland to Australia consists of names of Scots marrying from 1880 to 1895 and who claimed to be born in a Scottish border County.

Here are some names from Early Bristol

Dallas Co., Alabama, Marriage Book 1, 1818-1845, carries some marriages in Alabama.

The following are Index of Births, Devises Workhouses, Wiltshire, 1848-1902, Indexes of Deaths, Devises Workhouse, Wiltshire, 1866-1902.

Long Eaton is a township in Derbyshire, a small manufacturing town.

The following are files about Hampshire-Phillimores Hampshire Parish Records Volume 5, and Phillimores Hampshire Parish Records Volume 5 (2).

Taken from the 1841 Census in the Registration District of Corsham, is Inmates at Kingsdown Lunatic Asylum, Wiltshire.

The following list of some 650 names has been extracted from the micro-fiche of 1830 Directory of Gloucestershire. It covers the following towns,:- Northleach, Painswick, Chipping Sodbury, Wickwar, Iron-Acton, Stow in the Wold, Burton on the Water.

The Mayors, Lord Mayors, and Sheriffs of Norwich, Norfolk, 1835-1990, has been indexed by Marianne Philson, Feb 1993.

Names of officers listed in Whitaker's Almanac for 1894 as serving in ships in commission & in reserve in various parts of the world.

This list of ships should be read in conjunction with the previous file which lists the Officers.
