# YOUR AREA 100 YEARS AGO



The earliest tasks of the Ordnance Survey of Great Britain was to prepare a reliable map of England and Wales at a scale of one inch to one mile. These maps, known as the First Edition or Old Series were engraved on copper and printed between 1805 and 1873. They were revised from time to time, the most important change being the addition of the railway network. "David & Charles" printers of Newton Abbot, Devon have republished in exact facsimile of these printings. The reprint is edited by Dr. J.B. Harley of the Department of Geography, University of Exeter who has provided a bibliographical note for each sheet. Reprint size 30"x40". So far the only address we have is of "David & Charles", Newton Abbot, Devon (price £2.25 English) Perhaps Gould's also have them, it would be worth a stamp.


