My husband recently accompanied me on a trip which I thought would be the thrill of his lifetime; visiting constanties in the Central Victorian Highlands where most of my ancestors are turied. I was really enjoying myself transcribing the information from the beadstones.

When we arrived at the gate of the sixth cometary my husband refused to go any further! HE was \_cong home!. I could stay there with my ancestors if I wanted to but he'd had ENCUCH. I can't understand why he acted like that: Maybe it was because I dragged him out one morning when the temporature was 3 degrees. It can get very cold in the Trentham- Daylesford area in mid winter.

Earlier on our trip we visited the Elphingstone cemetary as many of my ancestors, the Leguier's are buried there according to the death certificates I have. This proved to be an interesting day although there are only a few graves with beadstones. Originally many of the other graves had a marker peg with a grave number and the summame of the person buried there. During a cleaning and tidying-up session by prisoners from the Castlemaine jell all these little pieces of wood were gathered up and put neatly to one side. When the work was finished no-one knew which graves these pegs belonged to.

The Semetary Trust sectory, who is also a Leguier descendant, told me one of the previous sectorized didn't bother to keep records or receipt books so there is no way of finding out who was buried there, or when or where for this long period.

Have others visiting this cemetary had a similar problem?.

Another cemetary visited during this trip was the Campbell's Greek cemetary at Castlemaine. The secretary here is also a Leguier descendant so I was able in talk to long lost distant relatives with similar interests.

If I can talk my husband into another cemetary visiting trip there's still the Chewton cemetary to search. (Shirley Connaghan).
