RECENT ACTIVITIES:

An interesting insight into the workings of the "Granite Mountain" was given by ELDER and SISTER WILCKEN of the Church of Latter Day Saints at our January meeting.

The meticulous checking carried out by volunteers (many of them elderly) is all the more amazing as we were invited to read an example of a Will written in "old English".

Also remember not to lay blame on the church if particular information is not available on the I.G.I. microfische. As Elder Wilcken explained, many records have been lost or destroyed in the past and the church can only produce what records they are given : "If a mouse has chewed away part of a document, it is lost forever!" were the words used. All in all it was a most enjoyable talk.

The first section of our February meeting was run as a "WORKSHOP NIGHT". We either worked on our own research, drove a typewriter on our Cemetery Transcription project, or simply circulated among other members absorbing what type of research they were doing and explaining why you were "stuck" in our own investigations. This ran from 7.00 p.m. to 9.00 p.m. and followed by a tightly run meeting.

It was a successful night and enabled social interaction between members that normally time does not permit. Guaranteed to re-kindle enthusiasm.

OLD S.E.C. MAGAZINES :

Dawn Cowley has in her possession two old copies of the S.E.C. Magazine - March 31st, 1943 and April-June, 1952. These include a great number of personal notices relating to S.E.C. personnel and their families. From the 1943 edition : News of men on active service: Pte. W. Fleming, Yallourn; Pte K.F. Calder; Pilot-Officer F.L. Proctor RAAF; Flying Officer Alf. Wilson RAAF; etc. Casualties: e.g. Obituaries for three employees: Sgt. Robin Dickson, RAAF from Richmond; Capt. Ian Reed AIF from Geelong; Sgt. Leslie Kennedy AIF from Yallourn. Also noted are several civilian deaths, marriages and births and over 1700 names of S.E.C. employees serving their country in the forces. The 1952 edition includes a number of obituaries Mr. H.J. Lawrence, Mr. A. Loveday, Mr. Irwin C. Jessup (Yallourn) as well as marriages, engagements and births. A list of men receiving senior appointments, including photos, and some social events are detailed. Please direct enquiries about the contents of these publications

BEGINNER'S CORNER

Elderly folk don't like to have things sprung upon them, so make an appointment before visiting and let them know the reason for your visit. This gives them time to search out any doments, papers, photos, etc. they may have to show you.

Letter writing is important. If you dont't like writing letters, now is the time to train yourself to at least tolrate it. Remember!! If you don't like to write letters you can't expect to receive too many.

Exhaust all free and low cost avenues of research before you start buying certificates, etc. That is : visit cemetries relevant to your research, write to relatives, particularly these who are elderly, talk to as many relatives as you can. Who knows? Perhaps they have in their possession a document such as a birth, death or marriage certificate which you could consult, thereby saving you needless expense.

ANCESTRAL OCCUPATIONS :

We found these in the Family Tree Magazine Vol. 1 No. 4 and they may be of interest to some people.

TRONER : an official who had charge of the weighing of merchandise at the tron (a weighing machine or pair of scales).

ALGNAGER : a sworn officer appointed to examine and attest the quality and measurement of woollen goods.

VERDERER : a judicial officer of the Eings Forost, sworn to maintain and keep the Assizes of the forest.
