"GUNYAH 1894 - 1940" by W.E. McNaughton

Bill McNaughton lived in the small Gippsland towm of Gunyah Gunyah once located in the hills of the Strzelecki ranges.

This book will be of interest to anyone who had family in the area as it includes maps, newspaper articles, school records (student lists and correspondence between Education Department and staff) family photographs and some old poetry.

Mr. McNaughton has compiled this book as a "labour of love". He researched, wrote the text and arranged printing. I found it a very readable book.

As he says in conclusion: "Thus has passed out of existence an era never to be regained - at least as far as Gunyah Gunyah is concerned"
