# local cemetery history 

THE Mid-Gippsland History So ciety recently handed over a copy of a two volume book entitled Traralgon Public Cemetery 1872-1994 to the Traralyon Cemetery Trust.

The books transcribe the cem etery's headstones and plaques and provide a detailed map to each section of the cemetery.

The Traralgon cemete:y has operated in its present location since 1872. however the cern. etery's records were accidentally destroyed by a fire in 1957.

Local historian John Davidson suggested the first burial at the cemetery was of John Salmon, an engineer who died from asphyxia after falling into a drain near the Traralgon Homestead while undeı the influence of alcohol.

Moumers at the first funeral carried axes and literally cut a track through the trees and scrub to the cemetery. which took them hours.

Work on the book began three years ago. when members of the society visited the cemetery with paper. pen and chalk over several weekends.

Each person was allocated a section of the cemetery and they
wrote down the exalt words engraved on ead headstone.

Headstone's in other communty tanguage were tramslated by perpte from those communities.

Records from Childers. Tiatal gar and Willow Grove cemetern. are already available.

The society will be publishim further records from Traralyon as well as from the Moed and Morwed cemeteries over the next , anombs.
