Message from the President

The 2017/18 Annual Financial Statement to be presented at the AGM later in the year is reproduced on page 5 in this edition of the ADHS Inc newsletter. It includes mention of the donations our members have been making to the "**Digitisation Fund**" and the purpose to which a major portion of donations made to date will be put in the near future.

The Canon Microfilm Reader/Printer which the Society purchased some twelve years ago has outlived its usefulness. Printing capability died a long time ago, and reading capability is also now unsatisfactory except for use by somebody with extreme patience. This means that the \$6,000 worth of microfilm we possess of newspapers, rate books, etc., is not able to be properly used. The Committee was exploring the available options to replace it in 2015, when our Founder suggested an alternative, which we adopted, as explained in Edition 280:

"Digitisation of the first five years (1863-68) of the Avoca Mail Newspaper has been completed. This project was initiated by our Founder, Helen Harris OAM who donated \$1,000 towards the cost; numerous other members between them donated a further \$1,000 and the Society paid \$500 from its own resources. The newspapers were scanned and OCR'd by the National Library of Australia and uploaded to Trove last June. We have been delighted to discover that reading the papers on Trove is much easier than reading them on our old Canon Microfilm Reader/Printer! We have learned lots about the early history of the district from doing this. Donations towards doing the next five years (1869 to 1874) are slowly trickling in. Please consider assisting us to commence it soon by making a donation of whatever amount you can afford. For \$50,000 we could put the whole 113 years on Trove; how good would that be!"

Several years ago NLA digitized and uploaded to Trove the Avoca Mail from 1870 to 1900, and 1914 to 1918, also the Avoca Free Press 1914-18, from their own resources without asking us for a contribution. 1869 was not done at that time, as they could not locate that year's paper as hard copy or microfilm. When it was subsequently located, in unbound hard copy, they had no funding to do anything with it, until ADHS Inc asked for it to be done at our expense. They no longer produce microfilm, but scan direct from hard copy onto disk, after carrying out some repairs and conservation work, which is being done at present.

Some ten years ago the newspaper room at SLV invested in a quantity of a device named "Scanpro" which enables users to view a full page of a broadsheet newspaper on a computer screen, copy or print the full page or a part thereof, and/or save it as a .pdf document. Soon afterwards the Carisbrook Historical Society purchased one of these, with a member donating the \$20,000 cost. They purchased a PC and large portrait-mode monitor to suit the Scanpro for another \$3,000.

Four members of the ADHS Inc Committee recently inspected that equipment at Carisbrook, learned that there are six volunteers competent to use it, and they are very happy with it. The Newstead Historical Society has purchased three Scanpro units second-hand at a greatly reduced price. These machines are made in USA, and have a local distributor in Victoria, who from time to time has available small quantities of Scanpro 2000 machines which have been traded in on Scanpro 3000. They are fully re-conditioned and guaranteed, for around half the price of a new model, and are the same as the Carisbrook and Newstead machines.

Dear Avoca Historians

We are writing to you to inform your organisation about the *University of Tasmania*'s short genealogical course, the HYPERLINK "https://universityoftasmania.cmail19.com/t/d-l-birhde-ykhddduduh-j/"*Diploma of Family History*.

The course is offered entirely online and comprises of eight units which all focus on different aspects of researching and accurately recording family history.

The first unit that will be offered is *Introduction to Family History*, which will commence Monday, 6th August and concludes on the 28th September.

This unit will teach students about researching family history generally, but will particularly focus on how to interpret historical convict records and intends to provide students with an insight into the lives of the first colonial settlers.

For new students commencing the *Diploma of Family History*, the first foundation level unit will be offered with a 100% HECS Scholarship*, which means that there will be no unit cost as it will be covered by the *University of Tasmania*. The subsequent combination of the foundation and introductory level units completed by the student, will be offered with a 75% or 50% HECS Scholarship*, respectively.

Students must complete four foundation and four introductory level units although we offer five units for each as options. Students are able to complete the units in any order, however must complete *Convict Ancestors* prior to applying for *Convicts in Context*.

If students are interested in *Introduction to Family History*, they can apply online through the application page. Please note that applications for this unit will close on 3rd August.

The **Hundred Days Offensive** was the final period of the First World War, during which the Allies launched a series of offensives against the Central Powers on the Western Front from 8 August to 11 November 1918, beginning with the Battle of Amiens. The offensive essentially pushed the Germans out of France, forcing them to retreat beyond the Hindenburg Line, and was followed by an armistice. The term "Hundred Days Offensive" does not refer to a specific battle or unified strategy, but rather the rapid series of Allied victories starting with the Battle of Amiens.

Comments on the Financial Statement

The majority of the donations received are included in remittances for renewal of memberships, and are banked in the General Account. Just prior to the end of the financial year, they are transferred from the General Account to the relevant other account, as can be seen in the penultimate line of "General Account Expenditure" above.

The General Account balance currently includes deposits of \$1,666.00 representing donations to the Digitisation Fund. A separate bank account for that Fund will be opened early in the new financial year, and that amount will then be transferred from the General Account. The 1869 Avoca Mail newspapers are being scanned by the SLV for uploading to Trove in the near future, and most of the funds that have been donated to date will be spent on that project.

The Committee has decided that we should replace the Canon Microfilm Reader/Printer, to enable researchers to utilise more effectively the \$6,000 worth of microfilm we have on hand. Please read an explanation of this matter on another page of the newsletter.
