Recent Speaker: Dr Ros Otzen

Ros chairs The Hester Hornbrook Academy Board. She was Principal of Korowa Anglican Girls' School from 1991–2003, establishing the Alliance of Girls Schools of Australia. Ros was the inaugural President of the Alumni Council of the University of Melbourne and is the former Deputy Chair of the Melbourne City Mission Board. Ros is also an historian and author: "To Make the World Anew: how particular nobodies made Australia".

Topic: From Ragged School to Modern Academy: Melbourne City Mission's "Hester Hornbrook Academy"

Dr Ros Otzen spoke about Hester Hornbrook, born in Jamaica in 1785. Her father, who married Mary Forbes, was an ensign in a British regiment. Hester married Thomas Hornbrook in 1800 having a daughter in 1802. Thomas may have died fighting the French. Hester visited the London City Mission in 1836.

Hester arrived in Melbourne in 1850 when Victoria's gold rush was abuzz, giving the promise of quick fortunes to dreamers near and far. Most who sought their fortune never found it and families — especially women and children — suffered. Overcrowding led to poverty and, as the population grew, social order ebbed.

Hester was friendly with Dr John Singleton, and his wife Isabel, who agreed with her that a Mission, similar to the London City Mission, needed to be established in Melbourne. They lobbied the Protestant churches, and at a public meeting on the 11th of August 1854, a proposal to accept a Mission was accepted. Hester managed the Mission from 1856 to 1862. She also founded nine Ragged Schools for the children of the poor in Melbourne between 1859 and her death in 1862.
