ON THE WEB

South American Brits Database: *http://sabrits.co.uk/Home.html* a site for British genealogists interested in South America. The transcriber started to record data from the Roots South America emigration mailing list in November 1998 initially, and had only 500 names. This has grown into a database of 26,000 people all of whom have spent part of their lives in South America.

Divorce: Use TROVE (free access to many Australian newspapers) to find divorces. Using a search criteria of divorce and the surname can bring up full reports of the entire court case and judgement. <u>http://trove.nla.gov.au/</u>

BDM Revival: Old DOS based genealogy programs and Digger disks can now continue be used on your new Windows 7 and Windows 8 computers. There is a new program available which you can down-load for \$19.99 that will allow you to continue to use them. It's called BDM Revival and has been written specifically for this purpose. <u>http://www.peppermintfence.com/BDMRevival.htm</u>

AUSTRO-HUNGARIAN EMPIRE: The genealogy website GenTeam has added some 400 new collections. Some highlights include citizen rolls from Bratislava, a marriage index for Vienna (starting in 1542), an index of Catholic baptisms in Vienna and Jewish indices of Prague for the years 1784 to 1804. The website currently has over 11 million records from Austria and surrounding countries. It covers most of the former Austro-Hungarian Empire. The website is in English. Access is free upon registration. It is definitely worth checking out if you have ancestors from the region. <u>http://www.genteam.eu/</u>

Usage of the computer network in the Family History Rooms and the Internet

In the last two months there have been problems on Computer 3 on the network with unsolicited advertising that has been interrupting internet sites. It appears that someone using that computer had inadvertently turned off the Trend Micro internet security and we had to download and install a Malware detection program to fix up the problems. 1000+ viruses and spyware programs were found. We are recommending that when anyone using the computers is asked to update a program that you **do not install** any updates. **You can either click on a box that says update later or just click on the X in the right hand top corner of the update reminder box.**

Often these updates contain programs that are hidden from view and during the update process you have ticked boxes that endorse down loading another program along with one you are already installing. Please do not download any updates or turn off the internet security. It has taken about five hours to fix the problem on one computer and we have to pay for this and it is not a good use of members' funds.

One final tip: If you are ever asked to install a website called ask.com please avoid this site as it will continually present you with advertisements and ruin your internet browsing.
