The Great Stupa of Universal Compassion, being built near Bendigo Australia, is 50 metres square at its base and nearly 50 metres high. This makes it the largest stupa in the Western World. It is the same design and size as the Gyantse Stupa (Kumbum) in Tibet. Beautiful gardens surround the Stupa and the Peace Park showcases symbols from many faiths including Catholic, Sikh, Islam, Hindu and Buddhist.

DENILIQUIN PASTORAL TIMES DIGITISATION PROJECT

To have the Pastoral Times digitised by the National Library of Australia (NLA) in Canberra, and then placed on Trove. A committee has been established with representatives from Echuca-Moama FHG, Deniliquin Genealogy Society, Edward River Library and Deniliquin & Dist. Historical Society. Four members of EMFHG, John Howe, Catherine Murnane, Shirley Durrant and Brian Ellis are members of this committee.

The Pastoral Times and Deniliquin Telegraph was first published on 26 May 1859, in 1861 it changed to the **Pastoral Times and ECHUCA AND MOAMA CHRONICLE**. Therefore, it covered the early years of Moama, Womboota, Thyra and Mathoura districts and Echuca and district. The Riverine Herald was founded 4 years later, at Echuca on 1 July 1863. The Pastoral Times is therefore a very important source for people researching family and local history in those early years.

The National Library of Australia's TROVE have agreed to undertake the digitisation using microfilm loaned from the State Library of NSW. The first Stage 1 of \$5,000 has now been combined with Stage 2, so \$10,000 has been sent to Trove and will digitising will begin in September and be finished by the end of this year. This is estimated to will cover from 1863 to approx. 1878.

DONATIONS to keep the project going are vitally important so that we can get all the Pastoral Times issues from 1859 to about 1954 up on Trove.
