Dear Friends of Benalla Library,

Are you enjoying the crispy mornings, blossom and blue skies? I agree we still need the rain, but I do love the feeling of spring in the air. Have you seen the beautiful leadlight made by Graham Pickering adorning one of our windows? It looks amazing and is very appropriate, with the fish and the view of the river outside.

July began with the announcement children and young adults under 18 will be fine free. This will relieve a large number of families and will encourage borrowing. Research has shown that most books still get returned in time. July school holidays were filled with exciting activities, with Naidoc celebrations being the highlight. A large group of adults and children attended, listening to Auntie Desiree reading stories, singing the Aboriginal children's song "Inanay" and then decorating wooden boomerangs.

To commemorate the 50-year Apollo Moon Landing, we had members of Astronomy Benalla giving a presentation, with accompanied slides and even a quiz. It was very well received. Due to threatening rain and a cloudy evening, we could not test the telescopes to check out the moon and stars.

What fun the staff had during Children's Book Week when we all dressed up on one of the days. The children were delighted. We gave away a \$25 book voucher for one lucky junior borrower.

During the last week of August, patrons could attend individual Tech Help, and attend workshops on basic internet skills and social media as part of the Digital Innovation Festival. The last day of the festival was for the children: a robotics workshop conducted by Robo Kids. This workshop was very well attended and parents and children were excited participating in this science based activity. General consent was to hold more of these activities in the library. We will investigate buying some science based materials.

Every Thursday morning, starting at 10am, you can drop in to a Card Making or Scrapbooking session. This is a new regular event run by Roslyn Archer. Keep your eyes out for another new, regular workshop run by Benalla Permaculture - on the first Saturday of the month. The first session was held on 7th September. The next session will be: constructing wicking planter boxes.

Anthony Sawrey will launch his latest book ,containing his father's artwork. Hugh Sawrey had his studio in Lurg and his work was very well known. I hope you are able to attend the launch on Wednesday 18th September at 6pm.

School holidays are in the last week of September and we are looking forward to an interesting session how to draw cartoons by Mark Guthrie.

## A Little can make a Big Difference Primary education in Papua New Guinea

Brian, accompanied by slides of the couple's recent visit to Papua New Guinea, outlined his long family connection with the region, which inspired him to become connected with Primary Education over there, in particular, the problems the country faces resourcing its greatly under-funded Schools. Brian has setup a project to get second hand books donated to be sent over to Goroka schools. He has also instigated a Brian Leigh Vial Scholarship program for needy students. Gita-Kristie and Vivienne, (pictured below right), two recipients of the scholarship, recently visited Benalla and Tatong. They spoke of the plight of under funded PNG schools. Following on from this talk, FOBL member Robyn MacLean and U3A member, Jenny Sawyer, gathered together some books and reading material to be sent to the Goroka village. From this beginning, FOBL and Benalla Library, with help from our President, Geraldine McCorkell, organised collection boxes to be placed in the Library and also in Steph Ryan's Office in Benalla. If readers have any Junior books they care to donate to this worthy cause, please take them to the two collection points. They will be much appreciated!.
