

# Author Visit: Noel Braun: 23rd October





Benalla Library and FOBL has had two recent author visits from writers who have walked the ancient Pilgrims Route of the Camino treks and who have been inspired to turn their experiences into a book. We had "Two Steps Forward" authors in 2018 and on 23rd October, we were treated to an absorbing account of Noel Braun's experiences walking the Camino's many routes and in particular, why he, in his 70s, first felt inspired to do so and why now, in his mid 80s, he still feels compelled to continue. "I Guess I'll Just Keep on Walking; Continuing the Search for Meaning", is his third book on the same subject.

Another book on the subject of walking the Camino is this title: "Motherling". Until now there has been no word for a mother who has lost her child. "Motherling" is a word Australian Jen Hutchison coined. This is her intensely personal story of grief, love and hope; finding and healing herself after that unspeakable loss: why she felt compelled to challenge herself by walking the 800km ancient pilgrim path — the Camino de Santiago — through Spain. "Motherling" will touch every mother, or indeed any reader who could benefit from reading Jen's book on finding a pathway to deal with immense personal loss.




