Staff have suggested having a TV monitor mounted to the wall behind Circulation Desk to run slideshow of upcoming events and programs to advertise to people waiting to be served and as patrons exit.

- Beautification Ideas and Signage, \$592.19 including postage

Staff have suggested getting signage that says "Sir Edward 'Weary' Dunlop Leaning Centre – Benalla Library" above the circulation desk and adding LIBRARY to the pole as you enter through the internal doors to add a little polishing to the area. Staff have also suggested that some fun bird window decals would help make the children's area more engaging.
