# Umbrella Dryer – \$1145 + GST + Postage = \$1335

Staff have suggested that, given it has been quite a wet few years, an umbrella dryer would be handy so patrons stop dripping water all through the library and splashing onto shelves.

# Height Adjustable Puzzle Tilting Puzzle Stand – \$456.80 each x2 = \$913.60

(The original one we were looking at is no longer available. This is the best next option. Men's Shed were asked if they could make something similar to this and they said they could not)

The puzzles are a fantastic thing for people to sit and do when they have time – we even have five regulars who come in to complete the puzzles. Getting a tilting puzzle board will help with OH&S issues and make the puzzle easier to see.

We now have the issue that the puzzles are so popular, that patrons have suggested having two on the go at once... as people have come in to work on it and two people are already there!

# Ian Trevaskis Author Talk – \$535 (\$450 talk + \$85 travel) or \$267.50 (50% of \$535)

We have had an enthusiastic patrons connect us with a semi-local author whom they would like to come to our library for an author talk. The quoted talk is outside our budget, but going half would put the figure in a much easier spend. If you would like to assist in getting this author to our library, we can find a suitable time this year. If committing to this is difficult this meeting, we could re-look at this suggestion at the next meeting.

# LONGTERM GOALS

**External Chute Upgrade** – Smart Bin and secure 24/7 chute for returns. Updated FE Tech price received (July 2023 – approx. \$23,000), but waiting on builder for quote and feasibility. Electrician guesses \$700 would cover powering the secure chute, but would need to confirm requirements with FE Tech.

**External Scooter and e-bike Charging Station** – I have been searching for grant opportunities to create a little clear area outside the library as a charging station for e-bikes and mobility scooters.

If you would like to contribute to this, I can take that into account when I source quotes and apply.
