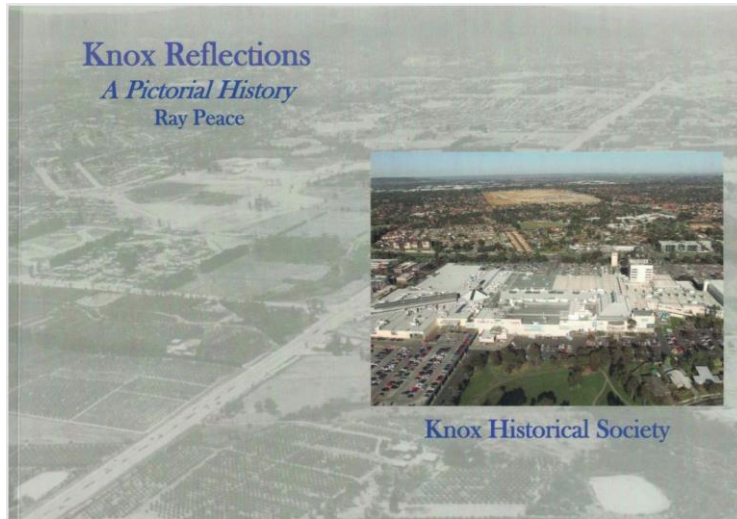


# Knox Reflections: a pictorial history by Ray Peace

Using hundreds of historic photographs, including process colour images nearly one hundred years old never previously published, KNOX REFLECTIONS brings alive the past, both distant and recent, through a series of images, with the stories behind the photos included, sometimes serious, sometimes quirky.

The trials and tribulations of our ancestors are documented, including natural calamities which have occurred many times over the years, and some of the lighter moments in the citizen's history.

Many forgotten highlights from years past, by sea, brought back to life: parades, dances, the routine of everyday life.

Grand plays that never happened in past years or the imagined. The what-might-be, events include a popular online feature to fit 1900 Victorian ladies in their sun-bonnets up the side of One Tree Hill's desperate final stand by the Army against rapacious forces of Japanese invaders on an island in Newville.

### The Long Arm of the Law

LAW AND ORDER arrived in Ferrisburgh early in its history. Cst. Barnett Lucas Carey was Ferrisburgh's first police officer. The police had a busy time, arresting criminals, rounding up stray animals, and making long trips across country. The British author JK Rowling was over hundred years in the future, so local criminals thought nothing of being apprehended by Cst. Harry Potter (right) in the 1880s. Cst. Potter died at Heathcote in 1914.

The Ferrisburgh police station was a small, friendly place in this 1940 photo, the police motorcycle is at left. S Cst. WH Lennon is at right, along with Cst. Charlie Light (left) and colleague Bernie Kennedy.

The police station was a prominent building in early Ferrisburgh in this 1950s photo at centre left on the bend in Barwood Road. The Shire Hall, now the health centre, left rear. Lending's store, at rear; the open area at right is now Woolworths. The police station and court complex was rebuilt in the late 1950s, and closed in September 1991.
