Who's Who in Stonnington - The Pryor Family

The Pryor family served the local Malvern community over a long period. William Henry Pryor (1849-1924) and John Pryor (1863-1933) were brothers from a large family of early Malvern pioneers who in 1886 purchased 64 and 66 McArthur (formerly Orchard) Street.

Both brothers worked as gardeners for the Malvern Council for over 30 years. William was a Trustee of the Spring Road Methodist Church and both William and John taught at the Sunday School.

William and Jane Pryor had 14 children, of whom 7 survived infancy. The family lived at 64 McArthur Street for about 30 years. For more than 40 years John and his large family lived next door at 66 McArthur Street.

The children of both families attended the Spring Road State School No. 1604. William and Jane's youngest son, George, was killed in action in 1916 during the Great War. His name appears on the Malvern War Memorial now located in Central Park. Both George Pryor and Charles Pryor, John's son, are listed on the W.W. I Honour Roll at Spring Road Church.

Various members of the Pryor family continued to live in Malvern until the early 1950s. During the 1960s L.J. Pryor, grandson of William Henry Pryor, was Principal of the Toorak Teachers College located at **Stonnington** in Glenferrie Road.


The Pryors have had a close relationship with Malvern for over 100 years. In October 2006 the laneway at the rear of shops in Malvern Road between McArthur and Cawkwell Streets was named Pryor Place.

Who's Who in Stonnington - Thomas W. Pockett O.B.E.

Thomas Pockett was born in England 150 years ago on 11 February 1857. He left school at an early age, obtained work in a nursery and by the age of 20 was foreman gardener on an English estate. He won his first prize for chrysanthemums at a Cheltenham flower show when he was 19.

Newly married to Louisa Bayliss, Pockett migrated to Australia, aged 21. Around 1882, Pockett obtained the position of head gardener at *Kenley* in Kooyong Road. Here he won the first prize offered by the Horticultural Society of Victoria, 'for the best arranged and best kept gentleman's garden within four miles of the Melbourne G.P.O.'

Around 1886 Pockett purchased land in Malvern Road at the corner of Shaftesbury Ave where he built his new home *Hatherley*. Many thousands of chrysanthemums were soon growing on vacant blocks surrounding the house.

In 1888 when Pockett relinquished his position at *Kenley* to concentrate on his chrysanthemums, he was approached by Malvern Council to prepare a plan for a Municipal Gardens, the site being a sandy barren paddock in High Street, on the corner of Spring Road. Pockett was then appointed Curator of Parks and Gardens for the Town/City of Malvern, a position he held for thirty years. During this time he designed both the Malvern Gardens and Central Park East Malvern.

Pockett designed Malvern's first public gardens in High Street with serpentine paths and no straight lines or formal angular beds. A row of English Oaks was planted each side of the drive, and palms, elms and flower-beds were planted. The lawns and planting were arranged so that long views could be obtained through the gardens. Pockett's design also included a fish-pond with artistic grotto work and handsome fountain.

Pockett spent more than 70 years breeding and growing chrysanthemums and as he achieved world acclaim, displays of his prize-winning blooms became a feature of the Malvern Gardens. Varieties raised by Pockett were grown all over the world. His blooms were sold internationally and won prizes at leading flower shows. They still feature prominently on Mothers' Day each year.

Pockett also helped with the design of other public gardens including those in Kew, Richmond, Hawthorn and Caulfield. In 1918 when Pockett retired from Malvern, he and Louisa moved to Healesville where Pockett established a successful nursery. In 1945 he was awarded the O.B.E. for services to horticulture and his world-wide success with chrysanthemums. Other members of the family, including Thomas' brother George and his children William, Rose and Jack, and grandson Tom, also made a contribution to horticulture. As well as Malvern's public gardens, Pockett's other long-standing legacy is the many miles of street trees planted throughout the municipality.

Photographs and memorabilia commemorating the 150th anniversary of the birth of Thomas Pockett (1857-1952) will be on display at the Customer Service Centre Malvern Town Hall Mon 26 Feb to Fri 9 March.
