



Training for the Melbourne Olympics, Central Park East Malvern, 1956

In 1937 John Landy moved with his family to Central Park Road, opposite Central Park East Malvern. The oval became Landy's daily training venue throughout the period leading to his setting of new world records in 1954 and his participation in the **Melbourne Olympics** in 1956. Landy won the Australian Mile Championship three times (1953, 1954, 1956), the three-mile title in 1956, set world records for the 1500 metres and the mile, and won two Games medals - a Silver in the 1954 Empire Games for the mile and a Bronze for the 1500 metres in the 1956 Melbourne Olympic Games.

Landy read the Olympic Oath at the 1956 Melbourne Olympic Games and retired from running the following year. On 2 March 1997 a ceremony was held to unveil the plaque naming the Central Park Oval the "John Landy Oval". John Landy was the Governor of Victoria between January 2001 and April 2006.

Tooronga's Changing Landscape

The view across Gardiners Creek from Stonnington has altered recently with the demolition of the **Tooronga Village Shopping Centre** on the corner of **Toorak** and **Tooronga Roads, Hawthorn**. In the 1970's the **Toorak Drive In** (built in 1956 as an Independent theatre, later Village/Hoyts and demolished in 1983) and the **Gasometers** dominated the view.

Robert Young – A Northbrook Connection?

A family researcher has contacted the Society after reading the article on the history of **Northbrook** on our website. www.vicnet.net.au/~malvern. She is trying to discover if there is a link between her relation **Robert Young** and the **Robert Young** connected to *Northbrook's* history.

The parents of her relation **Robert Young, Robert and Janet Young**, were from Perthshire in Scotland. They appear to have moved to Canada around 1882 where in 1883 their son Robert was born. Within a year they returned to live in Scotland where they had a second child, a daughter. By the 1901 census, Robert was aged 18, and he was listed as an apprentice electrician boarding in Dennistoun, Scotland. A newspaper cutting from August 1925 records the death of Robert's parents. His sister found his father dead at work, went home to tell her mother who then died within two

hours. The newspaper article states that their son Robert was in Australia at the time. The family think that following their parents' death Robert's sister (Margeritta [Ritta]) went to visit him in Australia and died whilst there. Her death is registered in 1934, in Malvern. (VC reg no 6043 Event D)

We know that the 1929 Malvern Council ratebook includes the name Robert **Young** as the owner of *Northbrook*, but only in pencil. His name does not appear on the Title for *Northbrook*. In 1929 an auction notice describes *Northbrook* as "a residence of 10 very large rooms, 2 bathrooms, a kitchen, scullery, pantry, large "Northbrook" High St., Malvern

cellar and ballroom. A noble allotment ...beautifully laid out in lawns, shrubs and flowers. With very substantial stabling and a loft The property is admirably situated for a first class Guest House or entertainment [']establishment".

The Sands & McDougall Directories show a butcher, **Robert Young**, occupying **271 Glenferrie Road**, Malvern from 1923 until 1934. This appears to have been the location of his shop. Council correspondence during this period relating to Northbrook includes 7/10/1929 - Plan of subdivision of Northbrook submitted to Council by Mr R.Young of *Northbrook*, High St - offering property to Council for purchase and 9/10/1929 - Council refusal to purchase. There is then a letter, 21/11/1929, referring to a cheque of £50 deposit for the purchase by Council of 50ft frontage of *Northbrook* abutting the cricket ground and 4/12/1929 correspondence referring to the purchase by Council of the above area from R. Young. In a letter 28/9/1931 Young is still pursuing Council to purchase the remainder of the **Northbrook** Estate, with Council declining by letter on the 21/10/1931.


The next correspondence between Council and the owner of Northbrook is on 18/3/1932, with the owner identified

as Edwards. The research continues in both Stonnington and the UK.

William Philpott

A request for information has been received from a descendent of an early resident, **William Philpott.**

In 1856, 20 acres at the south east corner of **Gardiners Creek [Toorak]** and **Glenferrie Roads**, was purchased by prosperous Commission agent, William Philpott and his wife Rosetta Wilhelmina Rucker. Philpott's land became the site of **Rosehill.** An auction notice which appeared in the Argus on 9 March 1869, describes the property as follows. "Rose Hill Toorak consisting of 90 acres of land, situated at [the] corner of Gardiners Creek [Toorak] and Glenferrie Roads, having a frontage to the former of about 1,300 feet, and to the latter 700 feet, or thereabouts. There are two acres in vines in full bearing, fruit, flower, and vegetable gardens. The remaining land is in shrubbery, planted with every variety of rare and handsome lawn trees. The house of brick with slate roof, has on the ground floor dining and drawing rooms, storeroom, butler's pantry, with drawers and shelving complete, and communicating with the dining rooms; kitchen with water laid on, servants' hall, laundry, servants'-room and lumber-room. Upstairs are large well-ventilated bedrooms with eastern aspect, dressing or bachelor's room, good-mixed bedroom, W.C. and bathroom, with water laid on by forcepump. Underneath are two cool airy cellars, fitted with bins and wine presses. The outer and inside walls are all 14 inch work. The present house, although quite large enough for the requirements of a moderate sized family, is capable of much

enlargement according to the original plan. The range of offices is complete, and built with surpassing care, every possible attention having been paid to the selection of material, workmanship, and drainage. next to the kitchen is a large coal-shed, brewhouse of ample dimensions, coachhouse, dairy (with shelves), harness room, seed and fruit loft above same, three-stalled stables and loose box adjoining all brick paved and carefully drained - cow lodge and drafting yards. Apart stands a most substantial bluestone building, with slate roof, which may be appropriately, termed a private chapel, with large ecclesiastically finished ceiling; there are two dormitories".

The bluestone chapel is all that remains of the **Rosehill estate**. **Society member, Anne Jackson,** has researched the Philpott family and *Rosehill* in both Australia and England over many years. The search continues for photos of both the family members and *Rosehill*.

Racecourse Hotel

Descendents of **John** and **Margaret Graham** (early licensees of the **Racecourse Hotel** on the corner of **Dandenong** and **Waverley Roads**, East Malvern) gathered for a reunion lunch in July. They celebrated both the 150th anniversary of **John Graham's** arrival in Victoria and the 150th anniversary of the building of the hotel.

Information wanted!

Henry Sutton 1856-1912 who lived at **9 Erskine Street, Armadale** in the late 1800's and early 1900's was a well known inventor, a co-founder of the **RACV** and together with his brothers, founded **Suttons Music Stores** in Victoria. In 1909 **Henry Sutton** was granted an experimental amateur radio licence and erected a radio tower at his house in **Erskine Street**. His brothers **Frederick, Alfred, Walter** and his own son **Arthur Ernest**, also lived in the Stonnington area. Stonnington Research Enquiries

During the past two months the Society has received requests for information relating to Caroline Sails Castle Maidment and her father William Hooper Maidment, who arrived in Melbourne in 1851; JR Cooper & Co Pty Ltd Timber Merchants and Joinery Specialists in Dandenong Road; a wedding at *Finchlea* 17 Manning Road; a wedding at a Church in Claremont Avenue; Avenues of Honour in the City of Stonnington; a painting of Alfred Edward Clarke; *Filyer* in Albany Road and Belmont Road and Hotel that appear to relate to Malvern England! All of these enquiries have been researched and expertly answered by the Stonnington History Centre staff Di, David and Ellen.

Taking Local History to the Community

The Society has been involved in discussions with the Stonnington History Centre regarding the naming of laneways off Repton Road, East Malvern and Milton Parade, Glen Iris. Society President Lorraine Sage, Vice President Jane Nigro and Committee Member Roxanne Dennis represented the Society at Stonnington Council's Committee of Management Workshop. A number of Committee members were present at the Stonnington Citizens of the Year Award Ceremony in July. Jane Nigro attended the first meeting of Stonnington Council's Heritage Strategy Review Reference Group.

Both Sunday afternoon winter talks were enjoyed by members and visitors. In June Graham Russell told of his long involvement with the 1st Malvern Scout Troop and donated a valuable collection of memorabilia to the Archives. Immediate Past President Bruce McBrien shared fascinating stories about the famous people he has met, at our July meeting. Thanks to both Lorraine and Roxanne for providing the delicious afternoon teas.

Lorraine Sage represented the Society at the recent meeting of the **Stonnington History Committee.** The agenda included the renaming of the Forrest Hill precinct in South Yarra, and updates on the Heritage Markers and the redevelopment of the Stonnington History Centre at Northbrook, Both the Melbourne Weekly and the Stonnington Leader continue to give our activities great publicity. The Committee would also like to let you know that, contrary to a recent newspaper report, there are no plans to amalgamate the two historical societies in Stonnington
