

St Catherine's Greek Orthodox Church Hall (former Peace Memorial Methodist Church)

Members of the **Methodist Church** held services in **Queens Hall**, opposite Caulfield Railway Station in 1906 until a small timber church was erected in **Epping St** in 1907. Church services were held in this church until 1921-22 when the **Peace Memorial Methodist Church** was built.

The foundation stone of the **Peace Memorial Methodist Church**, named to commemorate the end of WWI, was laid on **12 November 1921**. The arts & crafts style brick church, designed by architects **Arthur North & Louis**

Williams and Classified by the National Trust of Australia (Victoria), closed in 1976 and two windows were relocated to the Ewing Memorial Church in Burke Road East Malvern. In 1983, St Catherine's Greek Orthodox Church

relocated from the corner of Burke and Moama Roads to the **Epping Street Church and Hall**. The copper clad towers were added in 2001. The historic timber church hall in Epping Street was destroyed by fire 9 April 2009



Smith's Railway Hotel, Malvern



Kate Haley recently donated a small "Smith's Railway Hotel, Malvern" booklet to the Malvern Historical Society. The booklet dates from 1928-29 when Smith and Rankin were the publicans. First known as the Gardiner Hotel, then the Railway Hotel, the original building of 9 rooms and stables was built prior to 1856 on the east corner of Glenferrie and Dandenong Roads Malvern. At this time Dandenong Road was the main stock route to Gippsland and the hotel became a favourite stopping place for travellers. Early hotel licensee William Greaves was a noted Melbourne cricketer and he provided facilities for cricket and pigeon shooting. In 1862 Greaves established Victoria's first bowling club and green adjoining the original hotel. In 2009 the hotel is known as "The Angel".

While other municipalities had libraries, Malvern was the exception, with council reluctant to bow to community pressure. In the late 1940s one concerned group of women from the **Liberal Party** established their own free children's library. This operated

The name 'Liberal' was dropped when the library was run from Council premises and the **Town Clerk, Dudley Lucas**, became its treasurer.

In 1955 pressure from interested community groups forced the Council to a Library referendum. One group, with the committee named Library for Malvern Campaign Committee, (later to become the Malvern Arts Council) was formed to campaign for the 'yes' vote, which narrowly won by a majority of only 9%. As a teenager, (Dr) Alan Gregory, was secretary of this committee.

Malvern City Council then moved to establish a first class library service. A site for the new library was available in front of **Northbrook** in High Street and **Stewart Handasyde** was engaged as the architect. The foundation stone, which is still in place, was unveiled in November 1957.

With the building under construction in 1958, the first **City Librarian**, **P. A. Thomas**, took up his duties in preparation for the new service.

Local resident Lindsay Thompson, MLC and later Premier of Victoria (1981-82), supported the cause for the new library and was a guest at the opening by Mayor, Cr Sydney Hayes, on 20 May 1959. Lindsay Thompson spoke on the generosity of the State Government to municipal libraries. Alan Gregory gave the first talk in the new Library's theatrette.

The number of books on opening was 13,000. 11,600 members were registered in the first year and 292,000 books were issued. By September 1963, the Library had 15,593 members and plans were in hand to provide a branch library in the Chadstone area. In May 1963 the **Caulfield-Malvern Library Union (Caulfield-Malvern Regional Library Service)** was established. Since that time **Malvern Library** has undergone several renovations, including a major reconstruction in the 1980s when the library was temporarily housed at **Northbrook**.

The **Stonnington Library and Information Service** was created by the merger of the **Malvern Library Service and Prahran Library and Information Service** in June 1994.

Stonnington Research Enquiries

During the past two months the Society has received research enquiries relating to the **Vera Scantlebury Brown Trust**, the **Coor** family and business, the **Read** and **Huckell** families, **Urana Heale**, 20 Dixon Street, **Elizabeth Connelly, Bridget Walsh** and **Christina Comerford** who lived at *Umina*, Horace St, Malvern, James **Ferguson**, **Ardrie Park** and a vintage caravan built in **Darling Rd, Malvern East!**

An enquiry was also received from a gentleman who lived at *Heathfield,* **Kooyong Road Toorak** after his father had been appointed as **Deputy Manager** at the **Royal Childrens' Hospital.** He believes the house was used as night nurses' accommodation and accordingly one had to remain quiet for fear of disturbing the sleeping nurses! The family was initially housed on the ground floor in the billiard room which in fact was large enough to be divided up by curtains into about 4 rooms. There were also several large cork oak trees from which one could harvest large pieces of cork.

The first modern collapsible umbrella

Internationally acclaimed sculptor **Karl Duldig** and his wife **Slawa Duldig née Horowitz**, an artist and the **inventor of the first modern collapsible umbrella**, lived in Malvern East from 1955 to 1986. Graduates of the **Academy of Fine Arts in Vienna** their careers were interrupted in 1938 when, together with their baby daughter **Eva**, they fled from their homeland. After the war they became notable art teachers – **Karl** at **Mentone Grammar School** and **Slawa** at **St Catherine's Toorak**. The artists' daughter, **Eva de Jong-Duldig**, and her family, facilitated the establishment of **The Duldig Studio** in Burke Road Malvern East, as a public museum and art gallery which offers the community the opportunity to explore and enjoy fine art **(www.duldig.org.au)** The video of 'the invention of the pocket umbrella' was shown on a recent episode of the **New Inventors on ABC TV**.
