Dudley Lucas (1905-1990)

Dudley Lucas was born in Malvern in 1905. He joined the staff at Malvern Council as a junior boy in 1925. He was appointed Town Clerk for the City of Malvern in 1951, a position he held until his retirement in 1973.

An album, which covers the years 1951 to 1956, was donated to the Malvern Historical Society after Dudley's death in 1990. The album includes photos, invitations and programs relating to Malvern Council activities, such as Mayoral Balls, official openings, receptions and celebrations attended by Town Clerk Dudley Lucas.

Recently Dudley's son Neil shared some of his memories. He recalled that his father purchased, on behalf of Council, an engineering works on the south west corner of Glenferrie Road and Myamyn Street in Armadale. He bought it without any approval from Council and then announced at a Council Meeting what he had done! They backed him fortunately.

The diving tower at the Harold Holt Memorial Swimming Centre



The civil engineering firm Scott & Furphy was responsible for the calculations for the diving tower at the Harold Holt Swimming Pool. Architects Kevin Borland and Daryl Jackson, together with Scott and Furphy, prepared the specifications for the 10 metre tower in 1968. At the opening of the Harold Holt Memorial Swimming Centre the diving tower was shown off. Later photos of people diving off the tower were presented to Cr Stuart Winston Hall, who was the Mayor of the City of Malvern at the time. The diving tower was part of the redevelopment of the Centre in 2000, however in 2003, it was deemed unsafe and it has been unused since. The diving tower, together with the whole Harold Holt Swimming Centre, is listed on the Victorian Heritage Register. The complex is considered to be a notable example of 1960s Brutalist architecture.

Alan Gregory's memories

"I was involved with the Liberal Party at the time of the opening of the Harold Holt Memorial Swimming Centre. I think I was President of the Stonnington Branch, then a very large branch. It was part of the Higgins Electorate of the Liberal Party. Harold Holt was the first Member for the Federal Electorate of Higgins which covered all of Malvern and part of Caulfield and part of Prahran. Following Harold Holt's death John Gorton, a Senator, was elected leader of the Liberal Party and then contested Higgins (successfully). He then moved to the House of Representatives and became the Prime Minister. Country Party leader John McEwen had been Prime Minister in an acting capacity. I was Secretary of the branch during the time John Gorton was the member for Higgins. Members of the Stonnington branch included Malvern Councillors Julius Pollack and Doug Muir. They both told me that the council had to renovate the Malvern Baths but had financial issues. With the death of Holt they confessed that the Council decided to name it after Holt in the expectation of getting some Commonwealth funding. Ironically the Commonwealth did not come good with the money. The Council though was committed.

The Stonnington branch raised funds for a bust of Harold Holt. The donated bust did not meet the approval of Dame Zara Holt who said it made Harry look too fat. So she gave another bust to display for the opening. The bust the branch had given, by artist Geoffrey Jones, is in the Stonnington History Collection. I think Dame Zara took back the second bust of Harold Holt.

The opening of the Harold Holt Memorial Swimming Centre was grand. Mike Williamson was the MC. Sir John Grey Gorton, Prime Minister and Member for Higgins, opened the Centre. The inappropriate aspect of the naming did not seem to occur to the Malvern Council. While disappointed in the lack of Commonwealth funds they revelled in the grand event. I recall it as a lovely day weather wise as we were all seated outside. Of course the Council were thrilled they had had Prime Minister Harold Holt as the local member and it was fitting to honour him. The new pool was already in progress so it was ideal.

558 Waverley Road Malvern East

Thomas Tulloch was the owner of the vacant land that became 558 Waverley Road, prior to selling it to gardener (later contractor) John Bruce. John erected a brick house of four rooms on the land in 1893. His home was the only house on Waverley Road between Bruce Street and Sydare Avenue until the late 1940s. Following John Bruce's passing, the house was managed by his estate from 1946, and rented to Ruby May and Roy N Sorensen. Roy was later noted as having a life tenancy.

The house was sold to Jonathan Taylor in 1984. This section of Waverley Road, due to the naming of postal districts, has been known as East Malvern, Malvern East, Chadstone, Murrumbeena North and Carnegie North at different times. Bruce Street, Malvern East is most likely named after the owner of Crown Allotment 168, Thomas Dealey Bruce.

The Chief Protector

In 1838, the Secretary of State, Lord Glenelg, appointed George Augustus Robinson, the Commandant of the Flinders Island Aboriginal Settlement, to the position of Chief Protector of Port Phillip district. Robinson (1788-1866) lived in what is now known as the City of Stonnington from 1839 until his return to England in 1852.

In late July 1840, Robinson purchased at auction eight hectares of land for £744 on the south bank of the Yarra, on the hill at the bottom of Chapel Street. It was a 15 minute ride from Melbourne. Robinson noted that the name 'South Bank of Yarra' was the 'name of suburban section No. 8 on Yarra Yarra, south side'. Local Aboriginal people told Robinson the locality was known to them as 'Terneet'.

Robinson established a grand residence at Terneet and moved in on 14 October 1843. He was known to use several names for his residence including *Terneet*, *Claremont*, and *Rivolia*, sometimes written as *Tivolia* or *Tivoli*. The Terneet estate was highly regarded in Melbourne society. Many Aboriginal people visited his home and on occasions camped near his private residence. Protectorate officials and other public officers also visited Robinson's home to transact official business.

From 1839 until 1842, Robinson was responsible for the welfare of about fifteen Aboriginal people from Van Diemen's Land and Charlotte, a South Australian woman who was living with sealers in Bass Strait and came to Port Phillip from Flinders Island. Robinson's charges included: Walter George Arthur (Friday), Mary Ann Arthur, Lalla Rookh (Truganini), Matilda (Maria Matilda Natapolina / Maytepueminner), VDL Jack (Napoleon / Pevay / Jack Napoleon Tarraparrura / Tunnerminnerwait), Wooreddy (Doctor / Mutteellee), Fanny (Fanny Waterfordia / Planobeena), Timmy (Robert / Maulboyheener), Thomas Thompson, Isaac (Probelattener / Lackley), Johnny Franklin, Rebecca (Meeterlatteenner), Thomas Brune, David Brune (Myyungge / Dowwringgi / Leati) and Peter Brune (Droleluni). Some of these people lived at Terneet.

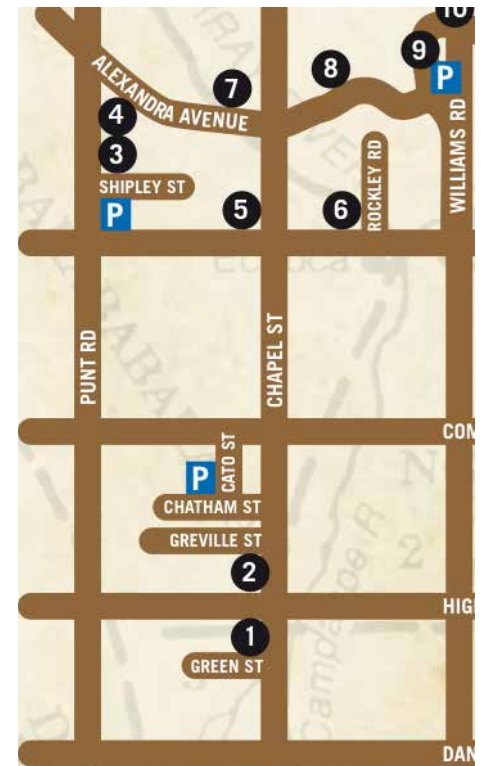

Thank you to Frank Pagram who recently sent the Stonnington History Centre a copy of a photo of the Auburn Juniors Football Club, taken in 1922.

The photo was taken on the the east side of Glenferrie Road Kooyong, looking south towards Kooyong and Toorak. A large number of the old houses can be seen on the hill.



Early Kindergartens in Malvern

The lead in providing pre-school education was taken by established local churches including St Andrew's Presbyterian, Gardiner, Ewing Memorial Presbyterian, Burke Road, Malvern East, and Lloyd Street Baptist Church, Malvern East. They all saw pre-school education as a vital community service and commenced kindergartens in their own premises in the 1940s. Within a few years, St Andrew's and Ewing had erected buildings specifically designed for kindergarten work and these, with some alterations, are still in use today.

During and after the Second World War, many young families were living in what was an established housing area and so there was a constant demand for kindergarten places at all the kindergartens in the area. Malvern Memorial Kindergarten was established in 1948 and has operated from its present site in Orchard Street Armadale since 1953. As with a number of other kindergarten premises the building was specifically constructed for that purpose and resulted from parent fundraising.

The Sunnyside Story

Sunnyside nursery school was opened in February 1945 in a private home in Thornbury Crescent, Malvern East. In 1947 the kindergarten moved to the Methodist Church Hall on the corner of Darling Road and Olive Street. Following many years of fundraising, and with support from Malvern Council, a purpose built facility was designed by architects F. Bell and K.E. Petherbridge, with later assistance from a parent, Stewart Handasyde who was also the Malvern Library architect. The Kindergarten, built on Council land in Cooida Place off Belgrave Road Malvern East, was opened in 1958 by academic and patron of the kindergarten, Sir John Medley.

The Van Cooth family and *Dimoia*

In 1902 Dutch merchant, Josephus Johannes (John) Van Coothand, married Maire Frances Emily Mason, the daughter of Francis Conway Mason MLA, Speaker of the Legislative Assembly in a fashionable society wedding. Three daughters and one son were born between 1903 and 1913. Their first daughter was born when the couple leased *Stratton* in Erskine Street Armadale. From around 1907 until 1913 the family lived at *Earl's Barton* (66) Central Park Road Malvern East. The family then moved to *Dimoia*, their mansion home in Wattletree Road, where they created their private golf course. John Van Cooth died at home at *St Cloud* 17 Grandview Grove Armadale in 1946. John's wife Maire died in 1964.

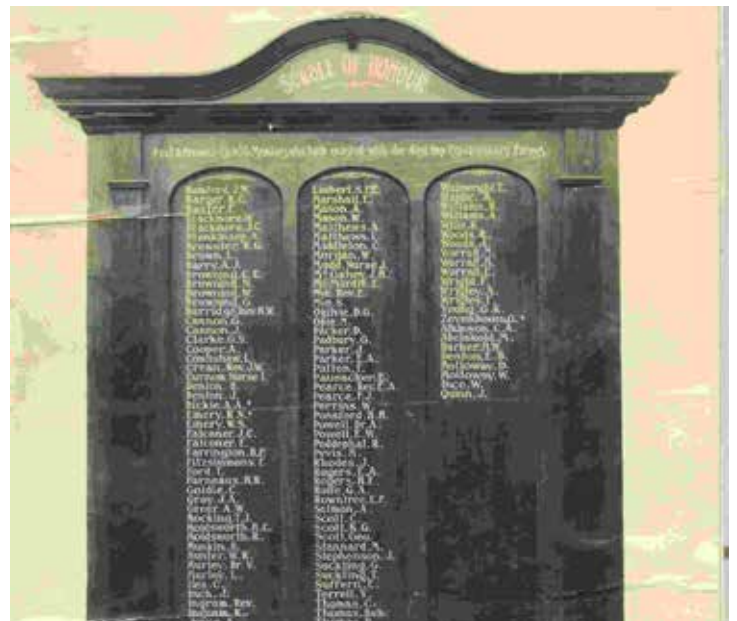
Dimoia was built for William Inglis in 1885-1886. In the 1920's, while the Van Cooth family owned the property, a private 9 hole golf course on four acres of land surrounded the two storey mansion. Many of the photos of the golf course were featured in *Golf In Australia*, May 3 1923. From 1927 *Dimoia* was subdivided and most of the allotments in Belson and Nott Streets were sold to architect Arnaud Wright.

Taking Local History to the Community

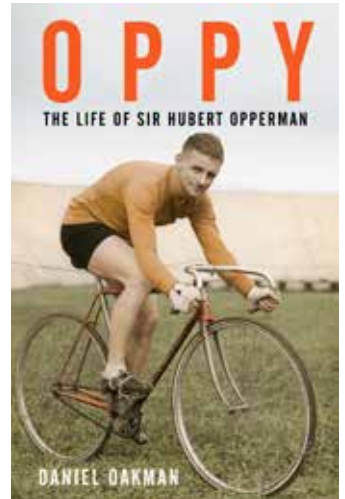

The partnership of 'Oppy' and Small made Malvern Star a household name and the business grew to become a bicycling empire unequalled in the Southern Hemisphere. Saving Australia's audiovisual heritage

More than 800,000 hours of Australian audiovisual content must be digitised before 2025 or it will perish, according to National Film and Sound Archive CEO Jan Müller. The Dutch-born archivist aims to form a hub of media preservation partners such as the ABC and other broadcasters, the film industry, libraries with audiovisual collections and the National Archives of Australia. According to Jan,

'It should be a joint task to build a shared national infrastructure for digitising audiovisual heritage.... There are so many audiovisual collections spread across the entire country, mostly still analogue, it is very fragmented. That needs some clustering and some leadership. We need to digitise as much as possible in the years ahead.'
