MacMillan's are one of the oldest clans in Scotland, being descended from a 12th century religious devotee called Gilchrist, who was a son of Cormac, bishop of Dunkeld, a great-great-grandson of the 11th century King Macbeth.

Sween - often said to be the oldest stone castle in Scotland - which he held for the Lord of the Isles in the 1470s.
