#### Members Profile Jeanette Rennie

#### When and why did you get started on your family history?

#### What names are you researching?

#### How far back have you searched?

Murray's 1717, Scotland, u confirmed. Hewat's 1578, Scotland, unconfirmed.

#### Who were your first ancestors to arrive in Australia?

My first ancestors were James and Wilhelmina Murray who arrived in Australia via Sydney in 1843 with their large family. They settled in the Bathurst-Lithgow area, a place called Mt Lambie. The original homestead is still occupied by Murray's and is full of family objects dating back from when they built 'Warrawang', the name of the homestead.

#### Who is your favourite ancestor?

It is hard to chose a favourite but I would have to say that Phillip Bowles, who was the first Bowles ancestor, because he chose to settle in this lovely country.

#### What is your most interesting find so far?

The most excited I got was when I came across both the Stapleton family and the Nalder family on the same day while browsing through the Rootsweb Mailing List, which provided to be a great bonus to me as they both sent me what they had on the families.

If the family tree wish fairy would give you the answer to one question. What would that be? I and the rest of the Bowles family would dearly love to find a record of Phillip Bowles birth in Tourquay Devon, approx 1821 so we could find out about his parents as no one has been able to

find it thus far.

#### 'WHEN ACORNS GROW'

#### A HISTORY OF THE YALLOURN MEDICAL AND HOSPITAL SOCIETY

While browsing the shelves in the local library I came across a book, 'When Acorns Grow' by Lyn Smith 1981, which documents the establishment and growth of the Yallourn Medical & Hospital Society, now known as Federation Health. The society first began in 1920, during the construction of the power station by the State Electricity Commission of Victoria and was established to meet the needs of the Electricity Commission workers who came to the Yallourn area. As the medical society was an integral part of the town and its residents, the book also describes the early days of Yallourn and its first inhabitants. Of interest are illustrations of early settlement, the Yallourn Hospital, society officers and staff along with the names of many local families. Some of which are listed below:

#### INDEX'S TO EXTRA BIRTH, DEATH AND MARRIAGE CERTIFICATES

Birth, death and marriage certificates in Victoria, although fairly pricey, are full of information useful to genealogists. Until 1988, a person purchasing a certificate from the Registrar of Births Deaths and Marriages received just that ...a certified copy of the certificate they had requested. Then things changed, and enquirers were issued with a copy of the entire page containing the requested entry. This means that enquirers now receive up to 5 death certificated five birth certificates and three marriage certificates as part of there basic enquiry. The actual certificate requested is marked with a red asterisk.

What a bonanza for an avid genealogist!! I approached the then president of the **G.S.V.** (Genealogical Society of Victoria) with the suggestion that these 'extra' certificates should be collected and collated, and the information found on them be made available to other genealogists. Permission was sought from the registrar, and was subsequently granted, with the proviso that the certificates were not to be photocopied for this purpose. And the project was born with yours truely being the one to take it on!

The idea is that genealogists (and any one else with certificates they don't need) forward these 'extras' to me, along with copies of any relation to their own research which they care to submit to the index. I ask that any certificate relevant to the donor's own research be identified with the name and address of the donor, for reasons which will become clear shortly. When I have accumulated about 2000 entries, an index is published. Interested parties and groups then may purchase the index, which becomes a very valuable research resource. The Mid Valley Family History Group has all eighteen index's published to date.

The full information from any certificate in the collection is provided upon receipt of a specific enquiry, listing the name/s required. There is a charge of \$1 per name requested, and a stamped self addressed envelope for the completed order.

Records are kept of enquiries for any certificate, and subsequent enquirers of a specific certificate are provided with the names and addresses of any previous enquirers, so that they are able to contact these persons, and maybe locate a family line connection.

Certificates are not exclusively Victorian, or even Australian! Donors have seen fit to send material from many parts of the world. It is only with the continuing support of genealogists that the index will continue to grow, and obviously any donations of certificates will be gratefully received. The publication of index 18 brings the number of certificates in the collection to more than 40,000.

Your support for this project would be very much appreciated, both by donating material to the collection and by going through the booklets, and seeing what's there that may be of use to you in your research. I'm sure you will agree that this is a very inexpensive way of verifying or eliminating those elusive members of the family tree.

#### RICHARD DAVIES - MY PHANTOM ANCESTOR

Richard Davies is an enigma. Did he exist? A great deal of effort has been expended in attempting to ascertain whether or not there was a Richard born to my Great Grandparents Emmeline (nee Hurrell) and William Davies.

William and Emmeline arrived in Melbourne on May  $2^{nd}$ , 1853 aboard the Earl Grey, accompanied with their first four children, with the youngest born on the voyage. The next year the fifth child - James - was born, but the family was not yet half completed.

Was Richard the next born? Mention is made of a child named Richard of three of the seven official documents to which I have had access, these being the birth certificates of three of the subsequent children born to these parents. There is no record of the birth of such Richard, but that in itself is of no great importance, as there is likewise no record of the birth of James (born 1854) or Charles (born two and a half years after Richard). As these were the first three of the Davies children born in Australia, it may have been ignorance on the part of the parents as to the requirements of official registration which caused this omission.

The birth certificate of the fourth child born in Australia, Walter Henry, does not name previous children of the marriage, but states that there are 4 boys and 2 girls. This does not allow for Richard. However the births of the next two children, Alfred and Albert introduced him to us!! Under the heading, 'issue, living and deceased' is the following:

The next born to the family was Francis Arthur and no mention is made of Richard among the previous issue. The father of the children, William Henry Davies was the informant on all of these certificates.

Next born was Edwin, with the informant being Richard Watkins, a friend from Dromana, and again Richard does not appear among the previous issue. We then look at the birth certificate of the last born, Emmelien. The informant on this certificate was the father, William Henry, and again we find Richard taking his place in the family, now listed as age 16 years. Each listing of Richard and his age is consistent with him having been born in 1856. It seems unlikely that such consistency of detail would be apparent on the occasions when Richard is recorded, if he was a figment of someone's imagination. However I can provide no logical reason for his exclusion on the times his father had been the informant.

The death certificates of both William and Emmeline list the names and ages of their children. Here again there is no mention of Richard, although listed is the first Emelien, the daughter who died at the age of fifteen. It can therefore be presumed that had Richard died by this time, he would still have been recorded as deceased.

A search of the index's to deaths in Victoria pre 1896 has been made, and there is no record of a death of any such possible Richard.

After exhaustive enquiries, these are the facts of the matter as far as I have been able to discover. On this stated evidence, I invite you to draw your own conclusions.
