INCREASES IN GOVERNMENT FEES FROM JANUARY 1st 1984.

Office of the Registrar of Probates :-

Searches will be \$11, which is an increase of \$12. A search of the index only, will be made for \$8. Photocopies will cost \$1.60per page.

Titles Office:-

Certificate of title, which includes photocopying will be \$5 instead of \$4.

Registrar-General's Department:-

\$3.50 per hour plus copying costs, an increase of 50c.

Department of Crown Lands and Survey:-

Research service hourly rate will rise from \$10 to \$11. Parish plans will cost \$3. A microfilm print will cost \$2.50.

A NOUNCING NEW PUBLICATIONS:

The most recent addition to our library is a facsimile copy of "MIDDLETON & MANNING GIPPSLAND DIRECTORY 1884-85". The directory contains all the usual commercial adds for that era for Gippsland and Melbourne, i.e. Merchants, Monumental Masons, Stock & Station Agents, Grocers, Printers, Erewers and the like. Also a listing of Banks for that era. The Bank of victoria, for example, includes the names of all managers for their Victorian Eranches.

The Directory deals with an alphabetical listing of persons from the shires of Sale, Bairnsdale, Warragul, Avon, Narracan, Buln Buln, Omeo, Imaralgon, Alberton, Rosedale, Tambo and Walhalla. It describes the Shires and Boroughs of the Gippsland region. An extensive write-up exists for Sale and Walhalla, all other shires are dealt with in smaller proportion. A map and article is included on the Gippsland Lakes area. Anyone with an interest in the Gippsland Region will find this book a valuable asset to their genealogical needs. An example from the Directory is as follows:-

> MOE. An agricultural township and station on the Gippsland Railway Line, with post, telegraph and money order office. 80 miles East of Melbourne; fares 13s,3d, & 9s. There is a bank, police station & two public halls. Coach for Walhalla, 32 miles, 3 times a week. Coal deposits in locality being rapidly developed. Formation, Volcanic. Population; 153.

The book comprises 134 pages and is currently available for \$8 in soft cover from Morwell, Traralgon and Bairnsdale newsagents and also the -.S.V. in Melbourne.

INFORMATION RECORDED IN TASMANIAN REGISTRATIONS OF

BIRTHS, DE ATHS AND MARRIAGES

Compulsory registration in Tasmania was introduced in December 1838. Prior to the 1838 Registration Act there was no direct registration of births, deaths and marriages and these can only be traced through church records, most of which have been transcribed by the Registrar-General's Department. Notwithstanding that registration was compulsory after 1838, there are many instances of either failure of local returns to be submitted, or neglect by the responsible party to make a registration.

Unlike their interstate counterparts, Tasmanian certificates do not give all the data that many people anticipate. The following information may be reasonably expected to be shown.

BIRTHS

Prior to 1896 particulars recorded were:

- Christian name (if known at time of registration, otherwise only sex is indicated) and surname.
- Date and place of birth.
- Christian names and surnames of parents.
- Maiden surname of mother.
- Father's occupation

In 1896 the date and place of the parents' marriage were added. In 1902 the ages and birthplaces of the parents were added. In 1909 previous issue (children) were added.

DEATHS

Prior to 1897 particulars recorded were:

- Christian name and surname of deceased.

- Date and place of death
- Age at death
- Occupation
- Cause of death.

In 1897 the birthplace of deceased was added. In 1914 age at marriage and number of issue were added.

MARRIAGES

1

Prior to 1896 particulars recorded were:

- Christian names and surnames of parties being married.
- Date and place of marriage.
- Age at marriage (sometime only whether "under" or "over" age, i.e. 21).
- Occupation and Status (i.e. bachelor and spinster).
- Names of witnesses to the marriage.

Names of parents and places of birth of the parties being married were not added until 1896.
