

Naming Traditions

Our ancestors often used the following naming procedure when picking out a name for a new child. This explains why certain names are VERY common in a given family line. Watching for these patterns can help in your genealogy research.

1st son = father's father 2nd son = mother's father

- 3rd son = father
- 4th son = father's oldest brother

5th son = father's 2nd oldest brother or mother's oldest brother

1st dau = mother's mother 2nd dau = father's mother 3rd dau = mother 4th dau = mother's oldest sister 5th dau = mother's 2nd oldest sister or father's oldest sister



IMMIGRATION DEPOSIT JOURNALS 1853-1900 at the GSV.

I have just been shown a wonderful resource which is getting less attention than it deserves. The above is a list of immigrants for whom a deposit was paid to assist them with their passage to New South Wales. Often the sponsors were relatives, so you may find other family members were already here; other sponsors may have been looking to employ the migrants when they arrived.

Information varies but usually includes the name of depositor or sponsor, date of deposit, particulars of the sponsored migrant including name, age, calling and address, name and address of the referee, amount paid towards the cost of passage and outfit, nationality of sponsored migrant, name of ship and date of arrival.

These records are particularly valuable for 1860-62 when the Board's Lists are missing and after 1870 when the Board's Lists no longer supply the place of origin within the county in Ireland. The Journals are on microfilm series A 28, with an index (sequenced by immigrants and by depositors) compiled by Pat Stemp & Aileen Trinder

available on microfiche. There is a supplementary index for 1856-7.

Accessing the film using the details from the index is easy.
