DAWN COWLEY'S

INDEXES TO EXTRA BIRTH, DEATH AND MARRIAGE CERTIFICATES

Birth, death and marriage certificates in Victoria, although fairly pricey, are full of information useful to genealogists. Until 1988, a person purchasing a certificate from the Registrar of Births, Deaths and Marriages received just that ... a certified copy of the certificate they had requested. Then things changed, and enquirers were issued with a copy of the entire page containing the registered entry. This means that enquirers now received up to five death certificates, 5 birth certificates and 3 marriage certificates as part of their basic enquiry. The actual certificate requested is marked with a red asterisk.

What a bonanza for the avid genealogist!! I approached the then president of the GSV (Genealogical Society of Victoria) with the suggestion that these "extra" certificates should be collected and collated, and the information on them be made available to other genealogists. Permission was sought from the Registrar's Office, and was subsequently granted, that the certificates were not to be photocopied for this purpose. And so the project was born, with yours truly being the one to take it on.

The idea is the genealogists (and anyone else with certificates they don't need) forward these "extras" to me, along with copies of any related to their own research which they care to submit to the index. I ask that any certificate relevant to the donor's own research be identified with the name and address of the donor, for reasons which will become clear as you read on. When I have accumulated a minimum of 2000 entries, an index is published. Interested parties and groups may access the index on the web or purchase the index in either book or CD form, which becomes a very valuable research source.

The full information from any certificate in the collection is provided to an enquirer upon receipt of their specific enquiry, listing the name/s required. There is a charge of \$1 per name requested, and a stamped self addressed envelope for the completed order.

Records are kept of enquiries for any certificate, and subsequent enquirers of a specific certificate are provided with the names and addresses of any previous enquirers, so that they are able to contact these persons, and maybe locate a family line connection.

Certificates are not exclusively Victorian, or even Australian!! Donors have seen fit to send material from many parts of the world. It is only with the continued support of genealogists and other interested parties that the index will continue to grow, and obviously any donations of certificates will be gratefully received. There are currently approximately 43,000 certificates in the collection.

Your support for this project would be very much appreciated, both by donating material to the collection and by going through the indexes, and seeing what's there that may be useful to you in your research. I'm sure you will agree that this is a very inexpensive way of verifying or eliminating those elusive members of your family tree.

FINDING THAT ELUSIVE PLACE NAME

PLACE NAME HELP

Ever had trouble finding out the meaning of the four letters used by the indexers who wrote up the BDM indexes? *Susie Zada* has come up with an easy way for you to find out, she says...

- 1. Give up guessing what the abbreviation is for it will still only be a guess and potentially far from accurate.
- 2. Use the other registrations near the number as they will be from the same main registration district and potentially have different abbreviations.

If the birth record you're looking at is IRIS, Reg 2473 in 1854, look at all the birth registrations in 1854 from Reg numbers 2460 to 2490 and you'll find the following ...

NEWT, SCOT, CHIL, ASHB, GEEL, CHIL, KILD, GEEL, SCOT, IRIS, CHIL, GEEL, CHIL, POIN, GEEL, SEA, NEWT, GEEL, KENS, GEEL

The above entries are for the Geelong region. They were most likely added to the State registers as a bundle - hence the consecutive numbers... for the above list read Newtown, Little Scotland, Chilwell, Ashby, Geelong, Chilwell, Kildare, Geelong, Little Scotland, Irish Town, Chilwell, Geelong, Point Henry, Geelong, At Sea (obviously landed at Geelong / Point Henry), Newtown, Geelong, Kensington (present day Leopold), Geelong and so it goes on.

So stop guessing – it's now a fact that IRIS = Irish Town which was in Chilwell, a present day suburb of Geelong.



WHY CAN'T I FIND IT?

In Jan 1819 the Rev John **YOUL** made a flying visit to VDL. He stayed 3 weeks during which time he performed some 65 baptisms & 41 marriages. He then went back to Sydney before returning to VDL in November 1819.

Post November 1819 his BDM data is in the AVRI and the TPI, however his Jan 1819 baptisms are not. If you are searching for data around this time then the answer could be in Z2360

St. John's (NG748)

Baptism register 11 Jan 1819 - 25 Jan 1819 NS748/1/2 Z2360
