THE COCKER CONNECTION - THE STORY OF BENJAMIN COCKER AND HIS SONS :

Four Yorkshire brothers emigrated to Tasmania and Melbourne. They traded as Cocker Bros Merchants on the site of Young and Jacksons Hotel in Melbourne and Cocker Alley still exists nearby. Later Benjamin jnr. became a professor in U.S.A., Joshua the first British Consul in Tonga, William was elected to the Provincial Assembly in Vancouver Island: David prospered in Devonport.

Written by the Rev. Dr. Mark Dalby M.A., a great great grandson of Joseph Cocker, this book concludes with a selection of unpublished family letters which vividly recall the hardships and achievements of the early pioneers in the 1850's and 60's.

INFORMATION SOUGHT - WILSON (ML.CALLUM-WILSON) - WITHERS :

John McCallum Wilson (parents James WILSON, Eliza McCallum) born 1812, Ayrshire, Scotland. Arrived Sydney 1839 on "Formosa". Married Mary WITHERS (parents unknown WITHERS, unknown WATERS, born Cork, Ireland 1813. Arrived N.S.W. 1837.) at Pinchgut on the Monaro, 1842. Overlanded to Gippsland 1843.

Children: Janet (b.1843, m.John Hargrave 1866) Mary Jane (b.1844, m. Robert Dowling 1864) Robert (b.1846, d.1893, unmarried) William (b.c.1849, d. 1866) Isabella (b.1852, m. John McInnes 1870, d.1934) Elizabeth (b.c.1855, m. ? McGuigan ?, d.1893-97) John McCallum (b.c.1857, m. Johanna Mary Hayes 1895, d.1905) Alexander (b.1860, m. Ellen Cima nee Stewart 1885, d.1932) Frederick (b.1861, m. Annie Short 1885, d.1937) Male and female died young.



INFORMATION SOUGHT - WILSON - WITHERS :

The family were living at Clydebank in 1847. John McCallum Wilson purchased land outside Sale in 1854-55 in an area known as "Square Forest" or "Rose Forest". He later owned property in the Newry-Upper Maffra area. He died in 1893. His wife died in 1897. A James McCallum Wilson who lived in Gippsland in the 1850's is possibly a brother.
