#### VOYAGE OF H.M.S. HERCULES 1852/53:

A series of accounts of the voyage of the emigrant ship H.M.S. Hercules is given in this 140 page book compiled by W.B. Clarke, 15 Parsons St., Flemington, Victoria, 3031 (\$10.00). This book was collated by the author whilst researching his mothers' family "McInnes". It describes the voyage of the "Hercules" from Campbelltown, Argyllshire Scotland on 26th December, 1852, via Cork to Adelaide and Port Phillip, July/August 1853. Reports include passenger lists, family lists, reports from the schoolmaster, surgeon and other letters between family members.

# Opening Remarks

- 1. New groups approved include wodonga and Irish Ancestry.
- 2. New group applications include Lakes Entrance, Narre Warren and Wangaratta.
- 3. Catherine House Records. For 1837 to 1980? the cost is £13000. The aim is to obtain 1837 to early 1900's. Donations of \$2 or more are tax deductable. Donations of \$10 or more entitle you to a free 5 year search when the records arrive. Donations can be earmarked to purchase particular years if so desired.

#### Group Reports

Group reports were presented. Some were good. Some were mediocre. One group seemed to be working very well. In later conversation he admitted apathy was a problem.

- 1.G.S.V. Seminars on Saturdays. Not successful in past, maybe Sundays.
- 2. Inter library loans G.S.V. to Country Groups. Linley Hooper replied: Travelling library not practical. If on loan, books unavailable for months in G.S.V.
- 3. Tax deductions for donations to Groups' libraries. G.S.V. solicitors checking, but looks okay firm decision soon.
- 4. Group rebates. Deduct rebate before sending money to G.S.V.? Reply. NO A. Groups will not know members' eligibility.
  - B. G.S.V. processing automatically allocates rebate.
  - C. Enables G.S.V. to keep accurate records.
- 5. Travel claims. Forms available next year!
- 6. Insurance of group holdings. Two options.
  - A. If group is a branch of the G.S.V .:-
  - A.1- All assets belong to the G.S.V. (Incorporation).
  - A.2 Record your holdings.
- A.3 Inform Graham Smith at G.S.V. of holdings' estimated value, place of storage etc. and he will arrange insurance.
  - B. Insure the holdings yourself.
- (The G.S.V. is presently incorporated via section 66 of the Companies Act. They are looking at transferring to the Association and Incorporation Act which is more applicable to clubs.)
- 7. Ballarat Cemetery Records. Old, new and crematorium Permission to microfiche is being organised. These will be available for sale in 2-3 months.
- 8. Australian Genealogists Computer Index, A.G.C.I. (Agsee) Brochures at the G.S.V. Transcripts of cemeteries (Headstones and and Registrations) sent to Sydney, sorted and indexed at Sydney Waterboard (Mainframe computer) Includes Irish Convict index. Out soon.

# INFORMATION SOUGHT - DAVIES/DAVIS FAMILY :

I am tracing the full family tree of Margaret Nee Evans Davies spelt Davis in the 19th. century and her husband John Davies who came to Georgetown to work in the Mersey Mines at Latrobe Tasmania.

John was born in February 1821 and Margaret was born in 1822 in Wales where they were married in 1843. John became a farmer acquiring 320 acres at West Kentishbury near Sheffield. They are honoured on the monument of pioneers outside the Sheffield Library.

Seven children of the marriage produced children namely:-

William Davies born 1856 died 1886 married Jane Elizabeth Morse. William Jnr. born 2/2/1879 Herbert and Lillian.

Elizabeth born 1857 married Andrew Smith born 1856 only known child Hubert Davies?

Mary Ann born 1850 married George Jubb children John Jubb, Harold, Sid, ? Mrs McNabb (Rudley) ? married James Castles (Stoodley), V Jubb.

Our grandmother Caroline Amelia Davies McNabb born 1859 died 1910 married John McNab born 1859 died 1926. Children Ivy, Iva and Vera.

Daniel born 1861 died 1934 married Emily Hammant born 1864 died 1938. Children Eric Sibble, John Edward, Albert, Ben, Horace, Maggie (H. Tuson), Lila (Adye Smith) and Claude Davies.

Ellen Davies born 1865 died 1888 married Robert Barnett Charleston born 1865. Children Samuel John born 1888.

Seth born 1868 died 1937 married Rose Clark born 1889 died 1971. Children Charlie, Harold and May.

The charges can be paid in Australian dollars, thus saving bank costs. Approximate charges are:-

B.D.& M. Certificates \$24.50 inc. 5 yr search and all exp.

\$31.50 inc. 10 yr search and all exp.

Census return per address per year - name of village or street and town must be stated: \$13.50

Wills post 1858 \$13.50 inc. 20 yr search.

Charts are also available listing major historical events. Two sets of charts are available, one covering Australian events from 1788 - 1914, and one covering British events from 1485 - 1914. These help to place an ancestor in his or her historical context. The price is \$10.00 for each.
