SEMINAR REPORT

Of particular note were her points about families or village groups coming out together, or being influenced to follow relatives or neighbours to this country.

Society documents local cemetery history

THE Mid-Gippsland History Society recently handerd over a copy of a two volume book entitled Tranalgon Public Cemetery 1872-1994 to the Tranalgon Cemetery Trust.

The books transcribe the cemetery's heads'tones and plaques and provide a detailed map to each section of the cemetery.

The Traralgon cemetery has operated in its present location since 1872, however the cemetery's records were accidentally destroyed by a fire in 1957.

Local historian John Davidson suggested the first burial at the cemetery was of John Salmon, an engineer who died from asphyxia after falling into a drain near the Traralgon Homestead while under the influence of alcohol.

Mourners at the first funeral carried axes and literally cut a track through the trees and scrub to the cemetery, which took

them hours.

Work on the book began three years ago, when members of the society visited the cemetery with paper, pen and chalk over several weekends.

Each person was allocated a section of the cemetery and they

wrote down the exact words engraved on each headstone.

Headstones in other community language were translated by people from those communities.

The book is part of a series on Mid-Gippsland cemeteries, which have been produced by the Mid-

Gippsland Family History Society

Records from Childers, Trafal gar and Willow Grove cemeterica are already available.

The society will be publishing further records from Tranalgon as well as from the Moe and Morwel cemeteries over the next a months.

The society believes *Translogor Public Cemetery 187.2. 199.4* will be an invaluable source of information for local historians.

They hope it will also be widely used nation-wide and internationally by family historians.

The book, which will be available for \$40 (\$35 for Traralgon Historical Society members) can be ordered with payment by writing to the Mid Gippsland Farmily History Society, PO Box 767. Morwell.
