You have until November 30th to post off entries for next year's Genealogical Research Directory. For \$29.75 and \$5.75 p+h you can enter 15 names and receive a copy of the directory. Extra entries are available at an extra cost. Forms are in our rooms somewhere.

The Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages is now located at 589 Collins Street. (Transport House). Their postal address hasn't changed, it remains PO Box 4332 Melbourne 3001 and for the cost of a local call you can phone them on 1300 369 367.

News from the registry is that at the end of October a new version of the Victorian Pioneers Index will be published (cost \$220) and that by the end of the year they intend to publish a consolidated deaths index 1921-1985 (cost, \$250 with the years 1981-1985 being released for the first time). These will be available on microfiche and CD-ROM.

The G.S.V now offers a new service. They will provide a transcript of an entry in the Old Parochial Records for Scotland (births/baptisms banns/marriages 1553-1854) for \$20.00 members and \$22.00 non-members. So check out the OPR indexes on fiche, CD-Rom or Scot's Origins on the internet. See Spring 1998 Ancestor for further details.



When researching at the PRO now you can pay for copies and purchases using Effpos, you can't withdraw cash though. For transactions over \$10.00 youcan also pay using your credit card. Also news from the PRO is that the Index to Inward Overseas Passenger Lists: British Ports 1852-1859 (unassisted) is now on line. http://shipping.cohsoft.com.au/db/britship.html


