

**AUSTRALIAN ROTARY'S 'WORLD WITHOUT POLIO EXHIBITION'** which was opened by Sir Gustav Nossal on Friday evening December 2 at the Daley Art Gallery, Charles Street, Kew (Trinity Grammar) (45 D6) will continue in Kew for three months.

This event is being sponsored by the Rotary Club of Kew, supported by the Rotary Clubs of Hawthorn, Glenferrie, Kew on Yarra, Boroondara and North Balwyn.

This free Travelling Exhibition, which began in the National Museum of Australia last year, tells the story in pictures, words and film of Rotary's Centenary gift to the children of the world. It relates the incredible story of how one Australian Rotarian's vision galvanised over one million Rotarians to enthuse 19 million other volunteers to vaccinate the world's children, in order to rid the globe of the crippling disease of polio.

The number of polio cases has been reduced by a projected 99 percent since Rotary and partner agencies formed the global polio eradication initiative from 350,000 in 1988 to fewer than 1,300 in 2004.
