David Gregan's Gig

I wish to bring you up to date with the situation regarding the committee of management for the Dromana Hall and OSO.

As linda greenberger has needed to resign from that committee, both in her capacity as its secretary and as the representative of rotary, i have volunteered to act in temporary fashion in both those roles. These positions for me have yet to be approved by this club and by the shire council. The council can only consider my position after i have ceased to be a councillor, which happens at the end of this month. The earliest possible date for council to consider the matter would be in february next.

I must advise, however, that i am seriously considering resigning as acting secretary and as an acting member of that committee. My reasons are that i consider that the committee is now rendered purposeless and of very little use under the new council rules that apply to the running of these committees and that it is no longer worth devoting voluntary time, effort and resources to the continuation of this type of committee. It would also appear that the hall committee has now achieved its most important purpose, which was to establish recommended design, scoping and budget provisions by the shire to build our new hall and integrate it with the additions and refurbishment of the oso building.

I need to discuss these factors at a board meeting of this club so that the club can decide on who may be appointed as our representative on the committee or in fact if it still desires to have a representative on that committee.

Another factor relates to the imminent establishment of abck, about which i have previously spoken. I believe that new association can and will have adequate community control over the new hall and community complex as well as other needed and desirable projects for kangerong ward. In effect it will be able to effectively replace or at least work in parallel to the hall committee.

Lieutenant. Amy York RAN –The History of Cerberus

Amy presented us with a slide show of the history of our naval base HMAS Cerberus. The establishment covers 1517 hectares and is 70 kilometres from Melbourne near Crib Point on Hann's Inlet, Western Port Bay. Purchased in 1911 and called Flinders Naval Depot, it was commissioned as **HMAS Cerberus** 10 years later. It comprises numerous training and recreation facilities, two chapels, small marina and attractive grounds.



The primary role of **HMAS Cerberus** has always been Navy personnel training. With the establishment of four tri-service schools over the last 13 years, this role has been extended to training Army, Navy and Air Force personnel.

Despite change, the charm of **HMAS Cerberus** remains. Its historic presence, heritage

buildings, chapels, sports facilities and gardens create a pleasant training environment. Navy-specific training includes School of Survivability and Ship Safety, which specialises in firefighting, damage control and nuclear biological chemical defence, seamanship and weapons training. **HMAS Cerberus** is also the home of the Recruit School and, for all sailors, their first contact with life in the Navy.
