**SALE ROTARY CLUB**  
**GRANTING THE CHARTER.**  
Members of the Sale Rotary Club and lady friends held an enjoyable social at the Club Hotel on Thursday night the occasion being the granting of a charter to the newly formed Club. Rotarian Governor Fred Birks, of Sydney officiated, Rotarian President G. H. Cramwick presiding.  
The meaning of Rotary and its aims formed the subject of interesting addresses, it being claimed that the Rotary movement which had extended to 44 countries was the greatest influence for world's peace the world had ever known.  
The granting of the charter from Chicago means amongst other things that the Sale Club, which commenced with sixteen members each representing a different vocation, will now be permitted to increase its membership.  
Amongst the visitors from Melbourne were prominent Rotarians in Rotarians Hartnell and Fred Newman, while Rotarian Doug Thompson was present from Albury.  
Telegrams of congratulations were received from different parts of Australia.  
During the evening Rotarian Newman who was with the Australian Rotarian delegation to Japan briefly related their experiences, telling of the lavish hospitality extended to them by Japanese Rotarians. At the Conference papers were read touching upon the White Australia policy by Australians and Japanese and it was gratifying to find that to a very large extent their views coincided; the Japanese seemed to quite understand our attitude on that question. He was sure from their experiences generally in Japan that the people there had a very kindly regard for Australians.
