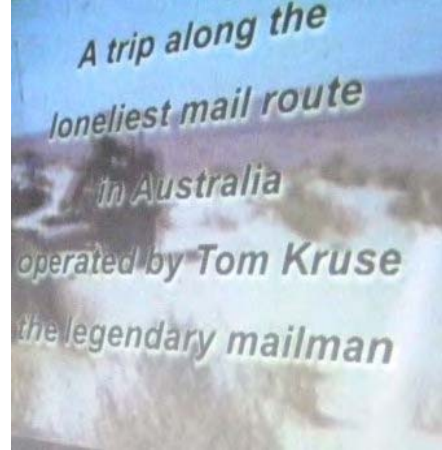

Five years ago with the help of the late Bob Pittman the film was converted to a DVD with a sound tract and narration by Bob. Following the viewing of the film Leo thanked David for his presentation and ingenuity in taking the film.
