Alan Lewis Club Service Director presents \$85,000 cheque to the Mayor making the Club Contribution to the River Heritage and Wetlands Trail \$155,000 for the past year. Alan thanked John Leslie a Past President and Paul Harris Fellow for his generous donation of \$100,000 the total cost of the project which was designed, planned and managed by the Club is estimated at \$314,000 The Government of Victorian Flood Relief Program contributed \$100,000 Wellington Shire \$20,000. The balance of project cost is being recovered by sale of the sponsorship of 12 interpretive signs at \$1,000 each, 5 sponsors contributed to date, work in kind and further donations.
