Monday 20th July 2009 Meeting Report Club

The chairman for the meeting Paul Harrison welcomed the 19 Rotarians, visiting Rotarian Rod Puls from Frankston North and guest speaker Robert Gaulton geologist stationed in the Latrobe Valley and a senior geologist with the SEC prior to privatisation. Thru a power point presentation, Robert



outlined the vast quantities of brown coal in the Gippsland area of some 160billion tonnes. The measured resource of 65billion tonnes situated in the three open cuts in the Latrobe Valley (Yallourn North, Hazelwood and Loy Yang) represent less than 3% of the total reserve and with comparably lower moisture content and overburden ratio are the most efficient brown

coal resource in the world. Comparison of moisture content and sulphur dioxide and overburden ratios indicated that the other fields in Gippsland, Gelliondale, Stradbroke, Gormandale whilst have indicative and inferred reserves of 93billion tonnes were not as economical with current technology current brown coal useage is 70million tonnes per annum. Following a spirited discussion during question time with respect to the implications of CO₂ liquefaction and other issues Rod made the usual presentation to Robert.



David Tulloch added a postscript to Brown Coal address In 1888 prospector Henry Goodridge found brown coal at Morwell...at the same time, 10 chain from the Goodridge shaft, William Tulloch discovered brown coal eight chain from the Latrobe River bank. The Goodridge mine was abandoned, and Tulloch formed the Great Morwell Brown Coal Co., bringing Otis staff from -
