His ability as a master conductor had the residents playing a tune within 5 minutes. He demonstrated his prowess by teaching the RC of Sale orchestra to play Twinkle Twinkle Little Star in under 5 minutes. It is especially good for people with dementia as the sounds are very soothing. Tyrrell pointed out that many of the people in aged care homes are people who have helped to build our country and they deserve some help to make the last stage of their lives more enjoyable. Rotary has successfully introduced participatory music to 9 homes in Victoria to date. In answering questions Tyrrell said that he helps in training the aged once a program has been established in a home. The cost of a set of two octave chimes is about \$2000 and a set of two octave bell plates is about \$800. President Rod added that he found the talk inspirational that our Club will help.
