Report on Meeting Monday 12th October



Chairman for the evening Keith welcomed the 18 Rotarians present and guest speaker Richard Elkington whose topic for the evening was Freemasonry. Richard started his talk by demonstrating the regalia he would wear to a meeting of the Lodge. Members wear dinner suits (or tails) and white gloves are worn to show

there is no designation of class all masons are equal. He indicated that he joined the Heyfield Lodge in 1980. Masonry is based on a sense of values, belief in a supreme being "The Great Architect" only males are admitted as members. The ritual of masonry in Victorian dates back to the sixteenth century by Scottish stone mason guilds which were based around the building of King Solomon's temple. He explained the symbolism of the aprons worn at meeting of the lodge from the simple apron of the entered apprentice to the apron of a master of the lodge. He noted that there was a number of orders representing different



facets of the craft such as the Mark, Chapter each representing another degree and level of learning. After questions Rod made the usual presentation.
