STAWELL – A BRIEF HISTORY

Before Gold was discovered in our area, many early Settlers had taken up farming large areas of land between Horsham and Ararat. Even earlier than that, Aboriginals had lived here for thousands of years.



In 1851 Gold was discovered in Victoria. By 1853 Gold was discovered in Stawell. At the time Stawell was called Pleasant Creek. The first person to find gold was a Shepherd named William McLachlan. He did not make any money from it though but thousands of people came here from all over the world looking for it. Some became very wealthy.



When the name of the town was changed to Stawell, it was named after Sir William Stawell. Many of the important buildings and old houses in Stawell were built during the Gold Rush by people who owned mines and made a lot money. Some of your Ancestors may have built some of these. Many others lived in tents and bark huts.

As you listen to the stories and look at some of the displays see if you can imagine what it was like to live here 150 years ago.

When you are going to school or shopping, see how many places you can recognise.


