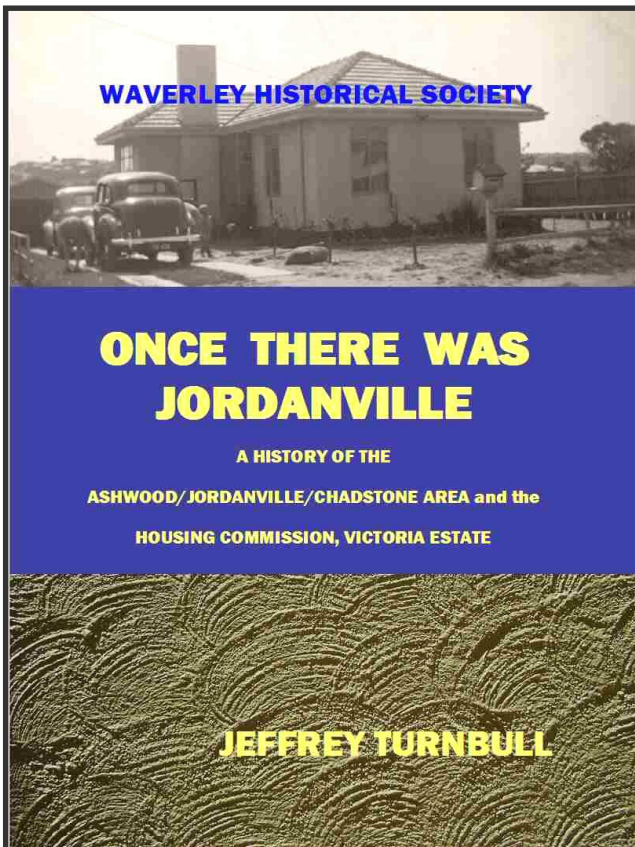


ONCE THERE WAS JORDANVILLE

A history of the Ashwood/Jordanville/Chadstone area and the Housing Commission, Victoria estate.

The current City of Monash has many suburbs but Ashwood and Chadstone remain unique because in the immediate post-World War II times of economic boom and expanding population, the area received a greater proportion of new-comers than anywhere else in the shire.

Essentially, the area was rural and quiet until 1947 when Housing Commission, Victoria moved in and built street after street of concrete and brick houses and two storey flats. The young married couples with children who occupied these low-cost houses increased Mulgrave's population six-fold between 1950 and 1956.

This book tells the story of the early development of the area which initially was the thriving suburb of Jordanville during the post-war baby boom period. It is the history as told by those who lived, worked and played there. Jordanville was their suburb and this is their story.
