ERRATA SHEET TO EXTENDED INDEX TO CATTLEMEN TO COMMUTERS

- Page 46 The two Herriot sisters who married two Wilson brothers were granddaughters of William Herriot, not daughters as stated.
Aaron Wilson referred to in the next paragraph, married Margaret Kate Herriot, while his brother, William ('Billy') married Elizabeth Herriot. (Again a generation error in the book.)
Note: The name Herriot is spelt with either a single 'T' or with two 'T'-s, in this case the single 'T' is correct, not two 'T'-s as in the book.
(3rd last line) Year 1872 should be 1669.
- Page 61, line 5 Kersine, correct it to read Kerosine
- Page 76 The man standing behind the horse and disc-plough is Mr Payne, later of Glen Waverley (father of Bill, Fred, Claire and Neill).
- Page 102 The name "Rock Forest" comes from the ancestral home of the Cotters (a baronetcy) near Mallow, County Cork, Ireland.
- Page 120 1858 may be the year when John Q. Cotter first rented the land from Archibald Michie, QC, but it was not until 1882 that he purchased the eastern half of portion 68, (80 acres). The man named as Walter Arnold is, in fact, William Dunlop. The man seated on the wagon showing the name Dunlop is W. ('Bill') Langen whose wife was a Dunlop. The man, standing by his horses at the right of the photo, is A.W. ('Bill') Chivers, whose wife was a Dunlop. The two wives were sisters of William Dunlop.
The date of the photograph would be pre-1907, as that was the year in which Bill Chivers moved to Glen Waverley.
- Page 148 The brickworks were in the southeast corner of Ferntree Gully Road and Dublin Street.
- Page 169 The photograph shown on p.169 was, in fact, taken in Waverley Road, slightly west of Watsons Road, and looking westwards across Glen Waverley. Note the Mechanics Institute on Springvale Road over the roof of the car, and alongside St Leonard's Catholic church. Also note the absence of the Yallourn-Melbourne electricity transmission lines on the hill above those buildings, indicating that the photo was taken prior to their construction.
- Page 183, line 3 Sampons store, correct it to read Sampson's store.
